Trembling Before God

he most profound reverence characterized the ancient copyists of the Scriptures. It is said that when they came to a name of Deity, they would put new pens into their writing instruments, took a bath, and changed raiment. What a far cry that is from our present-day irreverence for things sacred.

It is amazing to me how supercilious characters will approach GOD and His word with such contempt and barefaced irreverence in our generation. We chuckle at the commercial word: "When E.F. Hutton speaks, people listen." But in a far more serious vein, "Is the world interested in pausing to hear God" <u>JEHOVAH</u> has spoken...through the Holy Bible.
