



#### Luke 20:1-17

The holy gospel according to St. Luke the 20th chapter.

# Glory to you, O Lord.

¹One day, as he was teaching the people in the temple and telling the good news, the chief priests and the scribes came with the elders ²and said to him, "Tell us, by what authority are you doing these things? Who is it who gave you this authority?" ³He answered them, "I will also ask you a question, and you tell me: ⁴Did the baptism of John come from heaven, or was it of human origin?" ⁵They discussed it with one another, saying, "If we say, 'From heaven,' he will say, 'Why did you not believe him?' ⁶But if we say, 'Of human origin,' all the people will stone us; for they are convinced that John was a prophet." ⁵So they answered that they did not know where it came from. ⁶Then Jesus said to them, "Neither will I tell you by what authority I am doing these things."

<sup>9</sup>He began to tell the people this parable: "A man planted a vineyard, and leased it to tenants, and went to another country for a long time. <sup>10</sup>When the season came, he sent a slave to the tenants in order that they might give him his

share of the produce of the vineyard; but the tenants beat him and sent him away empty-handed. <sup>11</sup>Next he sent another slave; that one also they beat and insulted and sent away empty- handed. 12 And he sent still a third; this one also they wounded and threw out. <sup>13</sup>Then the owner of the vineyard said, 'What shall I do? I will send my beloved son; perhaps they will respect him.' 14But when the tenants saw him, they discussed it among themselves and said, 'This is the heir; let us kill him so that the inheritance may be ours.' <sup>15</sup>So they threw him out of the vineyard and killed him. What then will the owner of the vineyard do to them? <sup>16</sup>He will come and destroy those tenants and give the vineyard to others." When they heard this, they said, "Heaven forbid!" 17But he looked at them and said, "What then does this text mean: 'The stone that the builders rejected has become the cornerstone'?
