The History Lesson for the month of August:

August 1, 1779 - Star Spangled Banner author Francis Scott Key was born in Frederick County, MD

August 1, 1819 - Moby Dick author Herman Melville was born in New York.

August 2,1776 - In Philadelphia, most of the 55 members of the Continental Congress signed the parchment copy of the Declaration of Independence.

August 2, 1923 - President Warren G. Harding died suddenly in San Francisco, California.

August 2, 1990 - The Iraqi army invaded Kuwait.

August 4, 1961 - Former President Barack Obama was born in Honolulu, Hawaii.

August 5, 1962 - Marilyn Monroe died at age 36, from an overdose of sleeping pills.

August 6, 1945 - The first atomic bomb "Little Boy" was dropped over the center of Hiroshima at 8:15 a.m. The bomb was detonated about 1,800 feet above ground, killing over 105,000 persons and destroying the city. Another estimated 100,000 persons later died as a result of radiation effects.

August 7, 1964 - Following an attack on two U.S. destroyers in the Gulf of Tonkin off North Vietnam, the U.S. Congress approved the Gulf of Tonkin Resolution, granting President Johnson authority" to take all necessary measures to repel any armed attack against the forces of the United States and to prevent any further aggression."

August 7, 1990 - Just five days after the Iraqi invasion of Kuwait, President George H.W. Bush ordered Desert Shield, a massive military buildup to prevent further Iraqi advances.

August 8, 1945 - Soviet Russia declared war on Japan and sent troops into Japanese-held Manchuria. August 9, 1945 - The second atomic bombing of Japan occurred as an American B-29 bomber headed for the city of Kokura, but because of poor visibility then chose a secondary target Nagasaki. About noon, the bomb "Fat Man" detonated killing an estimated 70,000 persons and destroying about half the city.

August 9, 1974 - Effective at noon, President Richard M. Nixon resigned the Presidency.

August 13, 1961 - The Berlin Wall came into existence after the East German government closed the border between the east and west sectors of Berlin with barbed wire to discourage emigration to the West.

August 14, 1935 - President Roosevelt signed the Social Security Act establishing the system which guarantees pensions to those who retire at age 65.

August 14, 1945 - Victory over Japan (V-J) Day, commemorating President Truman's announcement that Japan had surrendered to the Allies.

August 15, 1969 – Woodstock began in a field near Yasgur's Farm at Bethel, New York. The three-day concert featured 24 rock bands and drew a crowd of more than 300,000 young people.

August 16, 1977 - Elvis Presley was pronounced dead at the Memphis Baptist Hospital at 3:30 p.m., at the age of 42.

August 17, 1998 - President Bill Clinton became the first sitting President to give testimony before a grand jury in which the President was the focus of the investigation.

August 18, 1929 - The 19th Amendment to the U.S. Constitution was ratified, granting women the right to vote.

August 24, 79 A.D. - Vesuvius, an active volcano in southern Italy, erupted and destroyed the cities of Pompeii, Stabiae, and Herculaneum.

August 31, 1997 - Britain's Princess Diana died from massive internal injuries suffered in a high-speed car crash. She was 36 years old.
