Dear Parishioners,
Today, we enter into Holy Week. I pray that your participation in Holy Week will bring you closer to Christ in his life, death, and Resurrection. I look forward to your participation in the Triduum services.

And, especially as you reflect on the Cross of Christ, in the vestibule of the church are a number of versions of the Stations of the Cross for you to take for your personal devotion.

We are still in need of individuals to sign-up for the Chrism Mass on Tuesday of Holy Week, the Washing of the Feet and Adoration on Holy Thursday, and the liturgical ministries during the Triduum.

Please, keep our RCIA candidates in your prayers as they prepare to be fully initiated into the Catholic Church on Pentecost.

I once again encourage you to make a commitment to the Bishop's Appeal, if you have not done so.

A word about the Triduum: The word itself comes from Latin as a combination of "three" and "day." The Triduum consists of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday and Easter Sunday. The main celebrations are the Mass of the Lord's Supper, the Good Friday Service, the Easter Vigil, and then Easter Sunday. These celebrations present the central events of the Paschal Mystery, Christ's passing over from death to life. The Triduum celebrates the heart of our faith and salvation. It is our yearly recognition of the great gift and mystery of the covenant God has established with us

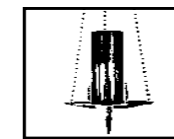
