

I. PURPOSE

The purpose of this policy is to establish broad curriculum parameters for the NWSISD that encompass the Minnesota Graduation Standards.

II. GENERAL STATEMENT OF POLICY

The policy of NWSISD is to establish learner results toward which all learning in NWSISD should be directed and for which all NWSISD learners should be held accountable.

III. DEFINITIONS

- A. "Instruction" means methods of providing learning experiences to enable students to meet graduation standards.
- B. "Curriculum" means written plans for providing students learning experiences that lead to knowledge, skills and positive attitudes.

IV. STUDENT PERFORMANCE GOALS

- A. NWSISD educational practices and instruction will be directed toward developing within each student a positive self-image and a sense of personal responsibility for:
 - 1. establishing and achieving personal and career goals;
 - 2. adapting to change;
 - 3. leading a healthy and fulfilling life, both physically and mentally;
 - 4. living a life that will contribute to the well-being of society;
 - 5. becoming a self-directed learner;
 - 6. exercising ethical behavior.
- B. Students will be given the opportunity to acquire human relations skills necessary to:
 - 1. appreciate, understand, and accept human diversity and interdependence;
 - 2. address human problems through team effort;
 - 3. resolve conflicts with and among others;

4. promote a multicultural, gender-fair, disability-sensitive society.
