

The Skilled Nursing Facility (SNF) Quality Reporting Program (QRP) Review and Correct reports are available through the Certification and Survey Provider Enhanced Reporting (CASPER) application. Providers can access these reports via the CASPER Reporting link on the “Welcome to the CMS QIES Systems for Providers” webpage. You must log into the CMS Network using your CMS Net user ID and password in order to access this page. The QRP Review and Correct report contains quality measure information at the facility level, allows providers to obtain aggregate performance for the past four full quarters (when data is available), includes data submitted prior to the applicable quarterly data submission deadlines, and displays whether the data correction period for a given Calendar Year (CY) quarter is “open” or “closed”. Be sure to correct data during the “open” period. Once closed, corrections will be reflected in your facility QM reports, but corrections will not be reflected in Nursing Home Compare since the data collection/freeze date is over.

Compare the Part A admission list with the Part A discharges, both physical discharges and those who remained in the facility after the Part A discharge.	
<i>Medicare PPS Discharge MDS completed at the end of each Medicare stay. If Section GG is not active on the Discharge MDS, it may not be coded correctly, or check to ensure A2100 is completed correctly. GG will not be active for “unplanned” discharges (discharge to hospital) or if MCR Part A stay was less than 3 days. If a discharge goal is not selected, 3863 error message will result.</i>	
	If the resident left “planned physical discharge”, and Part A stay ended on <u>day of or day before</u> the physical discharge, a combined PPS Discharge with the OBRA Discharge was completed and submitted.
	If the resident left “planned physical discharge”, and Part A stay ended <u>earlier</u> than the day before the physical discharge, a separate PPS Discharge and a separate OBRA Discharge was completed and submitted.
	If the resident was “planned discharged” from Part A, but remained in the facility, a PPS Discharge only was completed and submitted.
ON ADMISSION, the following MDS items coded correctly:

UPON DISCHARGE FROM PART A STAY, the following MDS items coded correctly:	
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A2400B&C Start date of most recent Medicare stay and End date of most recent Medicare stay are correct
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A0310F = = 10 or 11 (DRNA or DRA)
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A0310G = 1 Planned discharge (GG is not required for unplanned discharge)
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A0310H = 1 PPS Discharge assessment
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A2100 does not = 3 (discharge to hospital, since this would be unplanned discharge)

Compare the QIES/ASAP transmission report with the software transmission report to ensure acceptance. Both the 5 day and the Medicare PPS Discharge must be completed, submitted, and accepted into the QIES ASAP system for the data to count in the QRP measures	

PPS discharge assessment is completed when benefits exhaust, no longer skilled, hospitalization, discharge home or other destination. A PPS Discharge assessment is not required when death in facility or death while on LOA.
