THE LOVE OF GOD IN US

As Saint Stephen, the first Christian martyr, was put to death, he modeled for us a new way to pray. His is the



first prayer in scripture addressed to Jesus. Stephen prays to Jesus as Jesus had prayed to the Father. Stephen's last words, in fact, parallel Christ's last words on the cross. Significantly, when Stephen prays, "Lord, do not hold this against them," Saul would be included in that sen-

timent, as he approved and witnessed the execution (Acts 7:60). Saul—as Paul—would go on to become the greatest missionary of the Christian faith. Luke implies that Stephen's selfless prayer was answered, and answered in a way beyond compare.

Speaking of Saint Paul, it was not long after Stephen was martyred that he heard the voice of Jesus on his way to Damascus. But in the reading we hear today, Saul's allies "covered their ear," refusing to hear Stephen's testimony about Jesus (Acts7:57). The members of the Sanhedrin fail to hear the voice of Jesus because they refused to listen to it.

Three days ago, on Ascension Thursday, we celebrated Jesus' return to the Father. Jesus' mission here on earth was complete. But that mission is incomplete as

well. "That they may all be one," Jesus prays, envisioning a world that



comes together, that achieves the unity modeled by the Father and Son (John 17:21). It is a daunting task, but the route is laid out for us. Ensure "that the love with which you loved Me may be in them and I in them (John 17:26). With the love of God in us, directed outward toward our neighbor, Jesus is made manifest in us, in us all.

QUESTION OF THE WEEK:

How can I imitate the love of God? What concrete action can I take to show God's love to my neighbor?
