HAM BALLS

2 (4 ½ oz) cans deviled ham
3T chopped stuffed green onions
1 T prepared mustard
Tabasco sauce to taste
1 (3oz) package softened cream cheese
2 T milk

Combine cream cheese and milk and set aside. Combine rest of ingredients roll into a ball. Frost with cream cheese mixture. Chill. Remove from refrigerator 15 minutes before serving. Trim with parsley Marjorie Orlandini

BLUEBERRY CRUNCH

package yellow cake mix
 can (15oz) blueberry pie filling
 t lemon juice
 C nuts
 C (1 stick) melted butter

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Spread pie filling on bottom of a 9-inch square pan. Sprinkle with lemon juice. Combine dry cake mix nuts and melted butter. Sprinkle over pie filling. Bake for 40 to 45 minutes.

It is with the greatest of sorrow I must announce the passing of our Chapter's and my dear friend, Marjorie Orlandini. Margie was a very active member of our Chapter. Margie passed away on November 4, 2024.

Marjgie was part of the 1984 Program Committees that began the beginning of our current Programs. She taught classes at meetings, a beginner project on velvet in 1984, a watercolor in 1986, another painting on velveteen in oil in 1989 and Retreats in 1986, 1996 (Margie made a tape of the entertainment at the1996 Retreat and sent it to National). Margie was Social Director in 1985, National Tole Week (Decorative Painting Month) Chairman in 1986, Ways and Means in 1987 and Retreat Chairman in 1990 and 1991 and Hospitality Chair in 2012 & 2013.

She began collecting recipes for a Chapter Cookbook, The Golden Platter and had it printed and sold at Chapter for \$6.00.

She also housed several National Teachers including Helen Roberts during her seminar, saving the chapter money.

Marjorie will be greatly missed but all her dedication will always be appreciated and remembered

BOARD RESPONSIBILITIES

President Leads the meeting and guarantees all Chairmen do their jobs, has paperwork audited at the end of the year and handles any questions/problems Chairmen may have.

1st **VP** (Program Chair) arranges everything related to classes such as booking Teachers including GTDP teachers and National Teachers and their requirements, arranging dates for classes, fee for classes, supplies needed etc.

2nd VP (Membership Chair) receives payment of dues, keeps a list of members and checks them in at meeting and produces the Membership Book.

Recording Secretary records the actions at each Chapter and Board Meetings, compiles a list of Motions adding all to all previous records.

Treasurer handles all moneys from 4 Bank accounts and 3 GTDP Accounts, submits a year-end report to National and files taxes at the end of the year.

Publicity Chairman finds newspapers or free flyer in the area that you know will publish GTDP's classes, Retreat or Basket Luncheon information.

Newsletter Editor publishes the Newsletter 6 times a year in the off months of the Meetings. They collect Information from each Chairman, publishes the minutes and any information of interest to members.

Ways and Means Chairman handles raffles every meeting soliciting items from the Membership for the table.

Corresponding Secretary sends cards to someone who is ill, in the hospital, lost a family member or thank you cards.

Historian keeps a record of actions at each meeting and any outside GTDP activities.

Hospitality handles the purchase of supplies needed for our pot luck luncheons such as utensils, plates, napkins, pop and table coverings; arranges catering for the January Meeting and Christmas Party and gives suggestions for what to bring the remaining Meetings.

Parliamentarian makes sure we follow Roberts Rules of Order.

Decorative Painting Month Chairman finds places to display art work in October.

Spring Basket Luncheon Chairman makes all arrangements for our Luncheon, choosing a date, meals, centerpieces, favors, door prizes and main raffle.

Service Chairman finds nonprofit groups or deserving organization that needs help other than monetary where we can use our painting skills for useful items to the individuals.

Nominating Chairman makes phone calls or speaks directly to people requesting people run for office.
