



Joash: The Sole Survivor By Michelle Anderson

One of the most interesting people in the Old Testament was King Joash, also referred to as King Jehoash. His story illustrates how nothing can get in the way of the fulfillment of God's plan that there would be a Savior. One of the most fascinating things about the Bible is that it relates events and people's behavior in a time thousands of years ago, and today there are the same type of events and people's behavior. There are stories of murder, overthrows, idolatry, regimes that are God focused and God fearing. This article will provide background on King Joash's story which will include his lineage and the meanings of some names. The history of King Joash's lineage is shared in 2 *Chronicles* and 2 *Kings*. I will also explore the importance of King Joash's story and how God has preordained plans for His people, and nothing and no one can get in the way of fulfilling those plans. Through this research, I will also show that without King Joash the Davidic lineage would have died and therefore there would not have been a Savior through the Davidic lineage which was prophesized. The account of Joash is a piece in an even bigger story of God's faithfulness to His promises. Joash survived a massacre staving off a wicked plot that would have brought the Davidic throne to the edge of extinction.

Background of King Joash

Joash's lineage must be explained before the importance of his reign can be fully understood. The Savior would not have been born if Joash had not survived. For hundreds of years, the kings of Judah, would reign differently, some would follow God's ways and others would follow Baal's ways. Joash came from a long line of unrighteous rulers; his family was wicked. This quote from Why Everyone Should Know Joash, the Boy-King Who Survived a Massacre sums it perfectly, "Intermarriage between Israelite and Judean royalty added a twisted mess of seriously bad branches to Joash's family tree." Joash's father was Ahaziah, his grandmother was Athaliah, and his great-grandfather and great-grandmother were King Ahab and Jezebel. The historical background will begin with Joash's great-grandfather, King Ahab, and his great-grandmother, Jezebel.

King Ahab ruled over the northern tribes between 874 B.C. and 853 B.C. His name means "father's brother", this meaning seems to allude to twisted, inter-family marriages. He was considered the most evil ruler in Israel, he built a temple and altar to Baal and bowed down to him, and he was the first Israelite king to marry the pagan princess, Jezebel (1 Kings 16:29-31). He was not with God and God was angry with him. In 1 Kings 16:33, it states, "He did more to provoke the anger of the Lord, the God of Israel, than any of the other kings of Israel before him." King Ahab was killed in battle against the armies of Ramoth-gilead (1 Kings 22:29).

Then King Ahaziah, who was Joash's father, ruled a brief time from 853 B.C. to 852 B.C. Ahaziah means "Jehovah has grasped", this name is fitting for a man who was to be evil and unrighteous, he was not in God's protection or favor, instead he received God's wrath. King Ahaziah was also wicked, he joined forces with Jehoshphat and tried to regain Moab but failed, Ahaziah sought guidance from Baalzebub, the god of Ekron. In modern times, Baalzebub is another name for the devil. King Ahaziah was killed by Jehu, Jehu had rode to face King Ahaziah and King Joram and when they met, they asked Jehu if he was coming in peace. Jehu was upset by their wickedness, in 2 Kings 9:22, Jehu said to them, "How can there be peace as long as the idolatry and witchcraft of your mother, Jezebel, are all around us?" Jehu and his officers killed King Ahaziah and King Joram, this ended King Ahaziah's short, evil reign over Judah. When King Ahaziah died there was no one in the immediate royal family left to take the throne. The Queen Mother Athaliah decided to get rid of the entire royal line and take the crown herself.

After King Ahaziah was killed, then Athaliah reigned. Athaliah was married to King Joram who also "Did evil in the sight of the Lord" (2 Chronicles 21:6). When he died, Scripture says it was "To no one's sorrow," (2 Chronicles 21:20). Athaliah, Joash's grandmother and Ahaziah's mother, was the only woman who reigned in the list of kings of Judah, so she actually was a queen of Judah. Norman Geisler, who wrote A Popular Survey of the Old Testament, calls her the "The 'Bloody Mary' of the Old Testament." She reigned for six years from 841 B.C. to 835 B.C., she was a ruler of terror and Geisler wrote, "She almost succeeded in eliminating the bloodline of the Messiah." Queen Athaliah ordered all the heirs to the Davidic throne to be killed. In 2 Kings 11:1-3, it explains how Joash was spared from death. Jehosheba, the sister of Ahaziah, hid baby Joash and his nurse from the evil queen, and she hid him in the Temple for six years while Queen Athaliah reigned. Joash remained the only living descendant of David.

Joash became king at seven years old, he reigned for forty years from 835 B.C. to 796 B.C. Joash means "Jehovah has given", his name fits his destiny, God was with Joash and God had a plan for Joash's life, Joash had a calling on his life, God gave Joash life. Jehoiada, who was the husband of Joash's aunt, Jehosheba, who was the one who hid him, came up with the plan to overthrow Queen Athaliah. Jehoiada brought Joash to the Temple and he placed the crown on his head, anointed him and proclaimed him king, then everyone clapped and shouted, "Long live the king" (2 Kings 11:12). Then Jehoiada ordered his commanders to kill Queen Athaliah. In the beginning, while Jehoiada was alive and mentoring King Joash, he was righteous, and he followed the commands of the God. After Jehoiada died, King Joash started to backslide to idol worshipping like his ancestors. In spite of how he turned from God later in life, his life did provide the

Kingdom with great value, he was responsible for repairing the Temple of God and restoring the worship of the Lord in Jerusalem and because he survived the evil plot of his grandmother, the Davidic lineage continued. Neither of these could have been accomplished without God's protection and favor over him. This will be explained in more detail in the next section.

The Importance of King Joash

Firstly, during the reign of Joash's grandmother, Queen Athaliah, the Temple was desecrated and plundered for Baal worship. Once Joash became king, he worked to restore the Temple and reinstituted the offerings to God. Joash is responsible for repairing the Temple of God and restoring the worship of the Lord in Jerusalem. In order to pay for this restoration, he reinstituted tithing. Repairing the Temple was Joash's greatest achievement.

Secondly, Joash was the sole survivor of the Davidic lineage and through his bloodline, the Messiah would be born. The main point of King Joash's story is that God is always in charge and His plans cannot be thwarted. The prophet Isaiah foretold that the Messiah would be a descendant of King David (*Isaiah 9:7*), therefore, Queen Athaliah's plan to kill all the Davidic heirs to throne could not happen. The Bible also states that God made a covenant with David, "Your house and your kingdom will continue before me for all time, and your throne will be secure forever" (2 Samuel 7:16). Since Joash survived, Jesus was indeed born in David's line, Jesus was born 23 generations after Joash's reign. God is faithful to do what He promises. God had made a covenant with David. His plan was for Jesus to be heir to David's throne. Nothing could thwart that. God does what He says He will because He is Who He claims to be.

The story of King Joash is just one example of how God fulfills His promises, and how He uses people to fulfill His promises. In 2 Kings 11:1-3, it explains how Joash was spared from death by Jehosheba, his aunt. God used Jehosheba to keep Joash safe. This is similar to how God used Pharoah's daughter to save Moses. In Exodus 1:15-22, Pharoah ordered all the Hebrew boys to be thrown into the Nile River. When Moses was three months old, his mother placed him in a basket and sent him afloat down the Nile River (Exodus 2:2-3). Then Pharoah's daughter went down to the river and saw the floating basket and pulled the baby boy from the river and had a Hebrew nurse him, then Pharaoh's daughter adopted him, and named him Moses (Exodus 2:5-10). God had a plan for Moses' life; therefore, he could not be killed. Another example of God's faithfulness is God's promise to Abraham that he would be a father of all nations. Abraham and Sarah had Isaac late in life and Isaac was the promised child. Yet in Genesis 22:2, God instructs Abraham to "Take your son, your only son, yes, Isaac, whom you love so much, and go to the land of Moriah. Go and sacrifice him as a burnt offering on one of the mountains, which I will show you." How can Abraham be the father of all nations if he sacrifices his son? Abraham does not know, but he is obedient to God's instruction. Just as Abraham is about to sacrifice Isaac, God speaks and stops Abraham (Genesis 22:10-12). Due to Abraham's obedience, God then provides a ram for the sacrifice (Genesis 22:13). Then in Genesis 22:16-18, God says,

"Because you have obeyed me and have not withheld even your son, your only son, I swear by my own name that I will certainly bless you. I will multiply your descendants beyond number, like the stars in the sky and the sand on the seashore. Your descendants will conquer the cities of their enemies. And through your descendants all the nations of the earth will be blessed, all because you have obeyed me."

These are just three examples of God being faithful to his promises, and how God saved three young men who were critical to the fulfillment of His plans. The Bible is full of His promises.

Conclusion

The following key points have been fleshed out: 1) an explanation of Joash's lineage and his ancestor's reign of terror; 2) Joash's subsequent reign of righteousness and restoring the Temple of God, then his disobedience to God; and 3) Joash surviving was fulfilling the prophecy that the Messiah would be from Davidic lineage. The bottom line is that God is faithful, and He made a covenant with David that the Messiah would be from his bloodline, so there was no one who could alter that plan. God places faithful people right where they need to be to fulfill His plans, just like He placed Jehosheba in Joash's life, so that she could hide Joash and he could not be killed. Today, this should encourage people, because God is the same yesterday, today and tomorrow, since He was faithful to David, Moses, and Abraham, He will be faithful to us. Listen for God's guidance and the promises that God has for your life and know that He will align people and circumstances to fulfill those promises. The fulfillment of God's promises may seem impossible from our perspective, but nothing is impossible for God.

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Foot's Bible Study

Ezekiel 40:1-41:26

Whether the temple is literal or symbolic, it seems clear that this is a vision of God's final perfect Kingdom. This gave hope to the people of Ezekiel's time who had just seen their nation and its Temple destroyed with no hope of rebuilding it in the near future. The details given in this vision gave the people even more hope that what Ezekiel saw had come from God and would surely happen in the near future. (40:1)

God's holiness is a central theme throughout both the Old and New Testaments. The Most Holy Place was the innermost room in the temple (Exodus 26:33-34). This is where the Ark of the Covenant was kept and where God's glory was said to dwell. This room was entered only once a year by the high priest, who performed a ceremony to atone for the nation's sins. (41:4)

James 3:1-5:20

What you say and what you don't say are both important. To use proper speech, you must not only say the right words at the right time but also not say what you shouldn't. Examples of an untamed tongue include gossiping, putting others down, bragging, manipulating, false teaching, exaggerating, complaining flattering, and lying. Before you speak, ask, "Is what I want to say true? Is it necessary? Is it kind?" (3:2-3)

Bowing before the Lord means recognizing that our worth comes from God alone. To be humble involves leaning on His power and His guidance, and not going our own independent way. Although we do not deserve God's favor, He wants to lift us up and give us worth and dignity, despite our human shortcomings. (4:10)

The Christian's most powerful resource is communion with God through prayer. The results are often greater than we thought possible. Some people see prayer as a last resort to be tried when all else fails. This approach is backward. Prayer should come first because God's power is infinitely greater than ours. It only makes sense to rely on it - especially because God encourages us to do so. (5:16-18)

Psalms 118:1-29

There are days when the last thing we want to do is rejoice. Our mood is down, our situation is out of hand, and our sorrow or guilt is overwhelming. We can relate to the writers of the Psalms who often feel this way. But no matter how low the psalmist felt, they were always honest with God. And as they talked to God, their prayers ended in praise. When you don't feel like rejoicing, tell God how you really feel. You will find that God will give you a reason to rejoice. God has given you this day to live and serve Him - be glad! (118:24)

Proverbs 28:1-11

Rich people often think they are wonderful depending on no one, they take credit for all they do. But that's a hollow self-esteem. Through dependence on God in their struggles, the poor may develop a richness of spirit that no amount of wealth can provide. The rich man can lose all his material wealth, while no one can take away the poor man's character. Don't be jealous of the rich man's money, that may be all they will ever have. (28:11)

Stress Management Starts in the Mind By Rick Warren

"Think about the things that are good and worthy of praise. Think about the things that are true and honorable and right and pure and beautiful and respected." - Philippians 4:8 (NCV)

The battle with stress in your life begins between your ears. It's in your thought life. What you fill your mind with determines your level of stress. If you want peace of mind, you have to control what you allow into your mind.

For most people, the mind is like a freeway. They let anything drive through it. They watch shows that are full of junk and nonsense, scroll through social media sites that are polarizing, and listen to gossip that makes them envious. Then they're surprised when their mind's freeway becomes polluted with all of these things. And they wonder why their stress is so high.

The Bible offers another way. Philippians 4:8 says, "Think about the things that are good and worthy of praise. Think about the things that are true and honorable and right and pure and beautiful and respected" (NCV).

To lower your stress, change what you think about. In this verse, the Bible gives you eight tests for deciding if you should allow something in your mind. Ask yourself:

1.Is it good?

2.Is it worthy of praise?

3.Is it true?

4.Is it honorable?

5.Is it right?

6.Is it pure?

7.Is it beautiful?

8.Is it respected?

Think about the course of your week—the conversations you have, the books you read, the songs you listen to, the websites you scroll, the TV and movies you watch, and the things you do with your free time. How do all of these things hold up to that eight-question test? Are the things you're putting into your mind all week good, worthy of praise, true, honorable, right, pure, beautiful, and respected?

If not, it's time to start filling your mind with different things.

Each one of those eight attributes actually describes God. So, when you think about things that are good, worthy of praise, true, honorable, right, pure, beautiful, and respected, you're really picturing God.

Isaiah 26:3 says, "You will keep in perfect peace all who trust in you, all whose thoughts are fixed on you!" (NLT),

Corrie ten Boom—a Dutch Christian during World War II—knew the truth of that verse. She and her family hid Jews from the Nazis and were eventually sent to death camps, where her sister and father died. But through that horrible time, she discovered the secret of living with a mind at peace. She said it like this, "If you look at the world, you'll be distressed. If you look within, you'll be depressed. But if you look at Christ, you'll be at rest."

Whatever is going on around you, and the things you choose to think about, determine how much stress you feel. If you fix your thoughts on God, he will keep you in perfect peace.

Talk It Over

- How are you doing in the battle against stress in your life? When do you find it easy to direct your thoughts toward God?
 When is it difficult?
- Think about your favorite entertainment choices. Do they pass or fail the eight-question test?
- How can you direct your thoughts toward God more often throughout the day?
