

The best job security is when your owner thinks you are the best. Take nothing for granted.

Tech Talk #72

Going Digital (Dij-I-Tick-Ul)!

Following the aftermath of 9/11, a large amount of consideration was placed towards security and access into our buildings. Owners heavily invested in video surveillance systems as either upgrades or installations. The video systems available today are nothing less than awesome. This, of course, is dependent upon the depth of your pockets. Even if a system was not in your budget, funding was easily available after the devastation on 9/11. If you jumped onto the bandwagon, great! If you are contemplating a system, we hope this feature will help in your decision.

Technology

Present day technology is a far cry from the VCR tape, multiplexes, and multiple monitors. Heaven forbid even the thought of these being black & white systems. Although these systems are "almost" better than having nothing at all, you should strongly consider upgrading. The key word for present technology is "digital." There are many different styles and peripherals out there to choose from. However, if you stay within the confines of digital, you can build a system that would amaze James Bond.

Testing Your Video System

Much like the old Eveready commercial (not the one with the bunny), the statement of "Come on, I dare you" comes to mind when testing the reliability of your system. To test your system, try this simple test:

- 1. Pick the past date of "one week from today."
- 2. Add 2 hours to the present time.
- 3. Taking this time frame, go to your video system and capture any individual located at one of your main entrances or exits.
- 4. Tune and tweak whatever is needed to get the best picture possible.

Now, let's presume something has occurred, and you must surrender your evidence to the law enforcement agency.

- A. Can you easily recognize the facial features and fine details (for example, are they carrying anything)?
- B. Is the quality good enough that the picture could be used as evidence or identification?
- C. If the officer leaves with your tape or file, do you have any evidence left for future use?
- D. Were you able to accurately mark the exact spot on the tape for future viewing?
- E. Can you share the picture with others as a means to warn other property managers about a fugitive?

If you answered no to any of these, you may wish to consider an updated system.


Getting Started

Laying out the basics is a good start if you're not the type to rely on vendors for selection and pricing. Too many times, a Mercedes is requested, but the budget only supports a Chevy. What usually happens then is the de-selection of peripheral equipment in order to get the system within their pricing range. This ultimately lowers the effectiveness of the video system.

Although not in order of importance, consider the following when specifying a video system:

- The ability to monitor, record, playback, and remoteaccess "at the same time"
- Color
- Storage capacity or hard drive size (up to 960 GB available)
- Resolution

- · Reviewing capabilities and quality
- Adjustable recording capabilities (i.e., recording speed, post- & pre-event recording speed and dwell)
- Display and recording image resolution (up to 720x576 available)
- Record time labeling for easy searching
- · Compression algorithm
- Motion detection
- · Length of archive time needed
- Network abilities
- Auto-iris cameras

In most cases, "the more, the better," but never forget the most important option "User Friendly." To shop around and compare, visit http://www.cctvproducts.com

Finally, once a system has been installed, don't wait for an event to check out the operation of the surveillance system. On too many occasions, cameras are out of focus or are not

working at all. At least on a daily basis, check the operation of the video system. On a monthly basis, perform the test we described earlier to ensure quality. Things happen all too often but they are easily rectified if you stay on top of them.
