SECRETARY-TREASURER REPORT





Pride Of Washington Sale Chris Jansen



The 2023 On-Farm Challenge



Hol-Star Night Cort EX93



A special tribute to the 2023 On Farm Challenge Grand Champion, Hol-Star Night Cort E93. She comes from an excellent lineage, five out of her six closest dams are EX with the other being VG86. The five EX dams average 92.2 points. All six cows had the Hol-Star prefix. Her second lactation produced 44,630 lbs in 365 days and during her fourth lactation her highest daily production was close to 250 lbs.

She is part of a smaller herd of approximately 78 cows since the Portmann Family's last production sale. Currently, almost one third of the herd is classified Excellent. Their dairy is located near Raymond, Washington where they have been since 1976. Andy Portmann and his father Pete have been breeding superior registered Holsteins for years. Pete's father, an immigrant from Switzerland actually started the family dairying tradition but back then it was an all grade herd. Pete purchased the first registered stock and constantly improving the herd quality became their long game. The Portmann Dairy was on the cutting edge with embryo transfers, learning from the master, Dr. Studer (Carnation Farms). Their Dairy was also a trendsetter in robot milking, installing their first DeLaval robots in 2017. The move to robots has been a long-term positive one, but it came with its difficulties. With all of the transitions the robots brought it has also caused them to make changes to their breeding program. Andy explained suddenly additional importance was given to teat placement and compatibility with the robots.

Andrew King, Holstein Field Representative was very pleased with the results of the 2023 OFC. "All in all 2023 OFC was a great success and we hope to increase participation in 2024".

Clarence Okerlund Memorial Scholarship

The Board of Directors have approved a \$1,000 Scholarship, named in the honor of Clarence Okerlund, the legendary Herdsman of Carnation Farms. Clarence was awarded the Klussendorf Award in 1966 while employed at Vaucluse Farm, a very well-established Jersey herd in Portsmouth in RI owned by Diana Dodge Ryan. When Clarence arrived at Carnation Farms in 1968 he became the third on staff at Carnation Farms to hold that honor, joining Al Hay and Duncan Mackenzie.

Clarence's daughter, Mary Okerlund will serve as one of the review panelists for the scholarship. Applicants are required to be Junior Holstein Members and pursuing a degree or certificate. Students enrolled at Vocational and Trade School programs are encouraged to apply. More details are available at www.washingtonholsteins.com.
