Each spring and summer my mother-in-law always had a garden, even before her retirement from teaching school. She wore out a couple of troy built tillers during the time I knew her. My mother-in-law always waited until Good Friday to plant her garden: silver queen corn, blue lake green beans, better boy tomatoes, okra, and the like. She was a faithful church member, and I think planting on Good Friday had as much to do with the spiritual significance of that day, as it did with making sure the ground had warmed up enough to plant. She always had a large garden which allowed for watermelons, cantaloupes and squash to grow. Some plants just need a good deal of room to grow their vines. My mother-in-law made sure the young plants in her garden received the correct amount of fertilizer, and as summer progressed made sure the plants had plenty of water when rain was in short supply. Her garden was productive, but it did not occur by happenstance. She spent hours each morning working and hoeing in her garden. Come mid-July she had plenty of corn and green beans to can in quart size jars in order to be eaten throughout the year. Her lettuce, tomatoes, bell peppers and cucumbers made delicious salads. The potatoes she dug up from her garden and fried in oil were the best her children have ever eaten.

My mother-in-law followed through on her plans for a garden each year and she, along with her children and friends, were the recipients.

This Easter Season I remind you that God is one who has followed through on his plans as well. As foretold by the prophet Isaiah, God sent his son into the world to redeem the world from sin. As scripture proclaims: "For by His stripes we are healed." He died on the cross for our salvation.

This did not occur by happenstance, but was the result of God's loving plan for His creation. God did something for us that we could not do for ourselves, and it came at a great price. His body broken, his redeeming blood, shed for us.

We are invited to repent, believe, and allow Christ to be the Lord of our life... living as faithful disciples.

Because of Good Friday and Easter morning, we have abundant and eternal life.

I believe this is the primary reason that my mother-in-law chose to plant her garden on Good Friday. May we plant our faith and trust on Good Friday as well.

The children have been focusing on different animals that God has created with distinct characteristics. They have been learning how to apply these different qualities to their own lives in order to

be more like Jesus in their daily walk. However, this week's lesson is on the "bull." The bull is a powerful animal that has some good qualities, but it has one very big quality that we want the children to be able to recognize and fight against: being a "bully." As our children grow up they will encounter bullies. We want to teach them how to NOT be a bully, but also how to react when they encounter bullies.

Like adults, children have cares and worries too. Some are different than adults, but they generally come from the same source: the enemy of our souls. Some children are under the impression that they can NOT talk about or even mention GOD at school. THAT IS NOT TRUE. I am not sure why our students would think that. I am asking parents to bring this up in conversation and ask them why they think this. We need to correct this misconception. SATAN is the biggest bully of all and he will use any means available to HURT OUR CHILDREN and STEAL THEIR JOY and SOULS!!!! Parents, we need to pray over our babies and ask God to help us equip them to stand against the enemy. School should be a safe place, but IT IS NOT. Our children are faced with lies about creation, sexuality, and the like in our schools. We must utilize every opportunity to teach our kids the Biblical truths about God and his plan for us.

Talk to your children on a daily basis and find out what their concerns are. Ask questions. Find time to study God's word together. Pray with them everyday. Help your children to know the truth, because the truth sets us free.
