#### Greetings Friends,

In Matthew's gospel, Jesus says, <sup>19</sup> "Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust consume and where thieves break in and steal, <sup>20</sup> but store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust consumes and where thieves do not break in and steal. <sup>21</sup> For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." (Matthew 6:19-21, NRSVUE)

Valentine's Day seems like a good day to notice, and begin to explore where our hearts are at and what we treasure. This year Valentine's Day and Ash Wednesday are both observed on February 14<sup>th</sup>, and so we begin our Lenten journey on the very same day that we celebrate the love we treasure.

During the season of Lent, we are called to reflect on our lives in Christ, and to turn to God. The season starts with Ash Wednesday when we are reminded that from dust we are formed, and to dust we shall return.

The scripture passage from Matthew got me thinking about treasure, and that while we are made from dust, it is special, amazing, holy, cosmic, space dust! That we are God's treasure, creatures made in God's image, who are given the breath of God, that we might live and love, and let God's love shine through us out into the world.

We are treasure to God who loves us first, and empowers us to love God, others and ourselves too. We hold a treasure above treasures within us, which is God's Holy Spirit. And when we come together as God's people in the body of Christ, and share God's love with others we act as God's hands and feet in the world. We carry God's love wherever we go.

You are treasure, you are loved, and worth loving. You are loveable, because God makes good stuff. And here's the other thing, those things are true about us, and about all of God's children! Loved ones, strangers, whether we are difficult or easy to love on any given day, we are all loved by God and are special treasure. So when you're dealing with someone difficult, a stranger, or even an enemy, imagine that "God's Treasure" is written in invisible sharpie on their forehead.

During Lent we're called to turn to God, to spend time in reflection and prayer, meditation, and fasting, as well as commit acts of loving kindness, as we repent and spend time reflecting on our life in Christ.

As we journey together from Ash Wednesday toward the cross, it's a good time to consider what we treasure in our hearts. If we find some things that aren't really worth treasuring, we can loosen our grip on those things, creating more space in our hearts and minds to recognize and experience the treasure which we carry always in our hearts that is worth more than all else, God's saving love, hope, grace and kindness.



## Advent Shares: Hope Out Loud

Support from the HOL! (Hope Out Loud!) Capital Campaign saw Advent members participate in dozens of projects – some new, some one-time; some existing ministries were expanded or refreshed. The dedicated members of Advent who truly care about people in need were very active and supportive. One member shared: "When I had some tough years, my church came through for me! That experience changed me in big ways. I vowed that I would get involved more and & pay it forward". Helping others has made me a happier Christian." There are so many completed (and ongoing!) projects. These ministries are wide-ranging and varied – food, clothing, shelter, blankets, books, and prayers. Cookies at Christmastime.

Advent members help men, women, babies, children, people in prison, people in recovery from addictions, hungry people – in our community, our country, and around the world. Members have said that they feel joy in providing the services and the looks on the faces of the recipients reinforce joy there too. Some of the projects receive seed money from Thrivent Action Teams. Some of our favorite ministries and activities are Bombas Socks donations, books and Bibles for Berks County Prison, Christmas Cookies for Common Ground, the Hungry Yard Sale, Family Promise, our Little Free Library and Little Free Pantry, the (new in 2020) Prayer Team, and the many clothing drives.

As one example of the positive impact in the community: The Little Free Pantry was filled and emptied on the same day. We cannot keep it filled fast enough. Through our \$250.00 Thrivent Action Team sponsorship by members of different committees, we can grocery shop and fill our shelves in Advent's grocery shelves. We fill up my grocery cart three times a week and go outside to our Little Free Pantry. Within hours it had been emptied. Praise God for Thrivent and Advent's church members in helping fill our community's bellies with happiness through our wonderful blessed giving! Another goal of the HOL! The campaign was to increase the use of technology in our church life. In the middle of the pandemic, we premiered a fresh, beautiful, new website to tell people about Advent – reaching out in a modern way to share God's word and work with our neighbors, friends, and people who want to learn about God. This new website increases our visibility in the community and provides valuable information for members and visitors alike. Seeing new people attend and join our church brings



joy, creating more of a sense of "community". We continue to be inspired by: 1) Jesus' examples of sharing, healing — "love our neighbor as ourselves", (2) a thirst for learning about our faith through study and worship, (3) the need for support in our local and global community, (4) Reflection on our blessings and those less fortunate, (5) and, socializing with others while providing service. Members think Advent's sermons and services explicitly help to keep us inspired and filled with the joy of serving.
