- Simpkin home at 1603 4th Ave. South Amana. This former South Amana brick granary built when the village was founded has been fully renovated into a charming home - a one-of-a kind dwelling in the colonies.

- Conquest home at 4535 220th Trail, Amana. See what the Conquests have been working on since last featured on the walk. Inspired interior design and truly outstanding attention to detail in this Main Amana home.

- Brost-Ward home at 705 E. St. West Amana is where West Amana village history and artistic flair intertwine. The 1858 sandstone village bakery and home - among the oldest homes in the seven villages - has been lovingly restored and furnished to express the owners' point of view and interests.

- The West Amana blacksmith shop just next door to the Brost - Ward home will be open with live demonstrations. Bring the kids to see blacksmithing/ tin-smithing work (they'll be making cookie cutters) in this hearth-warmed shop. A step back into time to see what Amana life was like during the communal era.

- Shop the unique treasure trove of fine art, folk art, locally made crafts for sale at the Amana Arts Guild Gallery on Main. So many of your friends and neighbors have their work for sale here. Do your Christmas shopping the old Amana way.
