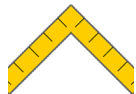

Brethren, Family and Friends,

The month of May takes its name from Maia of Greek mythology. Maia was the oldest of seven sisters, daughters of the titan Atlas, known together as the Pleiades. These were the companions of Artemis the hunter, and were translated into the constellation of stars which today bears their name. Not a great deal was written about Maia. Much more however was written about her son with Zeus, the Greek god Hermes, who became an important figure in mythology. Hermes was called Mercury by the Romans and in Egypt was so closely associated with the Egyptian god Thoth that the two were worshiped as one god. Hermes, it was said, was responsible for the transmission of much secret knowledge to humans. These secrets have been alleged to be the source of all of mankind's ancient wisdom.

Whether or not any of this interests you, you can't totally escape the influence of Hermes and his legend. There exist still today, relics of these ideas that linger in modern society. One, the caduceus, a symbol with two snakes entwined around a winged staff, often carried by Hermes in artwork, has become an emblem for medical care in the United States. Another is the term "hermetically sealed." This term which you've likely heard, means to be sealed completely, and derives from a legend in which Hermes produces a glass tube sealed airtight. This he did, as the story goes, through the mysterious practice of alchemy, which is one of the secret "arts" Hermes is said to have shared with mankind. Many groups have claimed to inherit, in some part or other, these same secret teachings and there are at least a few within Masonry who feel our own fraternity is part of this mystical lineage. Many of the symbols of Masonry – the square and compass, the sun and moon – are also symbols of Hermeticism. This of course could be a coincidence though many are convinced it's not.

With all the popularity of her son Hermes, mythology was relatively quiet in remembering Maia. Posterity however seems maybe to have dealt her a more generous hand. Overlooked for years, the attention going instead to her son, what could be more motherly? Perhaps then, it is ultimately appropriate that she would end up linked as she is now, in this close way, as the very namesake for the month of May, waiting each year, along with all mothers, to be remembered on Mother's Day.

Grand Master's Reopening Directive

Permission to Hold In-Person Meetings and Events, Subject to Limitations

April 13, 2021

April 15 in counties assigned to the red, orange and yellow tiers, but not to the purple tier.

At a high level, the applicable limitations are:

1. Indoor private events and meetings are not permitted in counties assigned to the purple tier.
2. There must be a guest list and a seating chart for any meeting or event.
3. Attendees must show proof of full COVID-19 vaccination or proof of a negative COVID-19 test within the last 72 hours.
4. The facility must create and implement a COVID-19 site prevention plan.
5. Under the California mask mandate, attendees must wear a face mask unless they are specifically exempted under the mandate
