#### Message From the Building and Grounds Chairperson

During the May voters meeting a comprehensive list of projects needed inside and outside of the the church was presented to the congregation. No vote was taken on the list, however, it was generally agreed to pursue proposals for the following:

- Replace the shingles, replace plywood as needed on the roof of the main building, Remove the guttering, make repairs to the facia boards, and reinstall the guttering. Two proposals have been requested for these services.
- Install a heat pump in educational building #2. Two proposals have been requested for this work.
- Install new partitions in the restrooms, paint the rooms and install new light fixtures. I am identifying suppliers of restroom partitions at this time.
- Proposed sanctuary improvements were also discussed at the May voters meeting, with no action taken. There was discussion during the June Council meeting regarding initiating a fundraiser to purchase new chairs for the sanctuary which would replace the current seating. It has also been proposed to move the pews to the perimeter of the church when new chairs are purchased.

All of these proposed Improvements would require congregational approval.

Once the cost proposals for roof repairs, the bathroom partitions/renovations, and/or the seating for the sanctuary are received, and the congregation has approved to move forward with any or all of these projects, a committee will make recommendations to the congregation regarding colors and other specifics. Four members of the congregation have volunteered to serve on this committee.


### Religious Persecution Afflicts One-Third of the Globe, Quoted from Page (4), The Lutheran Witness June/July

A study sponsored by the British government estimates that "one-third of the world's population suffers from religious persecution in some form, with Christians being the most persecuted group." Some Islamic extremist groups in Syria, Iraq, Egypt, northeast Nigeria and the Philippines seek to eliminate Christians "by the sword." Such violence, the commission's report concludes, can be so severe that it meets the UN standard for geneside.

Persecution is not always that extreme, but the report also documents anti-Christian laws, social restrictions enforced by vigilantes and mobs and other systematic means of suppression. The most severe persecution occurs in the Middle East (Saudi Arabia, Iran, Iraq, Qatar, Northern Africa (Egypt, Libya), sub-Saharan Africa (Nigeria, Kenya, Sudan, Eritrea), East Asia (China, North Korea, Laos, Vietnam), Central Asia (Afghanistan, the former Soviet states of Kazabstan and Tajikistan and Southern Asia (India, Pakistan, Sri Lanka). The persecution of Christians, according to the report, comes from several sources, including militant Islamists, radical Buddhists and Hindus, and Communist, nationalist, and other authoritarian governments.
