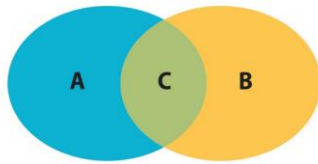

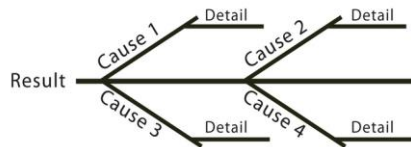

Only 38% of U.S. high school students graduate ready to learn in college or the workplace (ACT, 2016)

THE SOLUTION

Nonfiction structures are a part of our daily lives, our teaching, and our learning.

With purpose, learners use Cornell notes and nonfiction structures to develop a new

confidence in nonfiction thinking, reading, and writing. Only pencil and paper required!
