Pleasure Divisions -Do not cross enter pleasure divisions

Lead line - Both English and Western compete in this division Children 10 years of age and under. Multiple attendants are permitted to enter the arena with the competitor if needed. *Classes for Lead Line –Appropriate Halter (1, 2, 3 or 4) 63, 69, 70, 71, 105*

Walk-Halt – Both English and Western compete in this division. Open to riders of ages 11-and over. The purpose of these classes is to transition a rider from lead line, provide classes for riders who are not quite ready to trot or build confidence from a setback.

Attendants are permitted to enter the arena if needed. *Classes for Division - Appropriate Halter (1, 2, 3 or 4) 64, 72, 73, 74, 104, 106*

Therapeutic Rider – Both English and Western compete in this division. No age restriction for this division. Open to riders who are unable to participate in other divisions without accommodations. Attendants are permitted to enter the arena with the competitor if needed. *Classes for Division - Appropriate Halter (1, 2, 3 or 4) 11, 12, 13, 66, 107*

Novice Youth – Both English and Western compete in this division. Riders age (11 -18) and for riders that are not comfortable with gates above Trot/Jog. *Classes for Division – Appropriate Halter (1, 2, 3 or 4) 8, 26, 27, 28, 97, 104, 109, 115*

Novice Adult – Both English and Western compete in this division. Riders age (Over 18) and for riders that are not comfortable with gates above Trot/Jog. *Classes for Division – Appropriate Halter (1, 2, 3 or 4) 9, 29, 30, 31, 97, 104, 110, 115*

Masters –Riders age (30 and over) (Walk/Jog/Trot) and for those not comfortable with riding at lope or canter. Both English and Western compete in this division. *Classes for Division – Appropriate Halter (1, 2, 3 or 4) 9, 23, 24, 25, 97, 104, 110, 115*

Western 10 and under – (Walk/Jog) Riders in western tack, hat and long sleeve shirt.

Classes for Division – Appropriate Halter (1, 2, 3 or 4), 5, 16, 17, 18, 97, 104, 108, 115

English 10 and Under – Riders of Saddle seat, Dressage and Hunt Seat, tack. 10 years of age and under. (Walk/Trot)

Classes for Division – Appropriate Halter (1, 2, 3 or 4) 5, 19, 20, 21, 97, 104, 108, 115

Western Jr. Youth – Riders 14 and under. *Classes for Division – Appropriate Halter (1, 2, 3, 4), 5 or 6, 38, 39, 40, 97, 104, 111, 115*

English Jr. Youth – Riders of Saddle, Dressage and Hunt Seat 14 years of age and under (walk/trot/canter).

Classes for Division – Appropriate Halter (1, 2, 3 or 4) 5 or 6, 87, 88, 89, 97, 104, 111, 115

Western Sr. Youth – Riders 15-18 years of age. *Classes for Division – Appropriate Halter (1, 2, 3, 4), 7, 41, 42, 43, 97, 104, 112, 115*

English Sr. Youth – Riders of Saddle, Dressage and Hunt Seat between the ages of 15 -18 years (walk/trot/canter).

Classes for Division – Appropriate Halter (1, 2, 3 or 4) 7, 90, 91, 92, 97, 104, 112, 115

Adult – Riders age over 18. Dressage, Saddle Seat, Hunt seat and Western compete in this division.

Classes for Division – Appropriate Halter (1, 2, 3 or 4) 10, 97, 98, 99, 100, 101, 104, 113, 115

Open divisions – May enter any that are appropriate.

Ranch Horse – Ranch horse classes are designed to show the movement and versatility of the working ranch-style horse. Western Tack and attire. *Classes for Division – 32, 33, 34, 35*

Cross Rails – Open to Hunt Seat riders of any age. ASTM riding helmet is required. Cross rails will not exceed 18". (No Halter or Showmanship class included in this division) *Classes for Division – 75, 76, 77, or 78, 79, 80*

Hunter – Open to Hunt Seat riders of any age. ASTM riding helmet is required. Open to riders 18 and under. (No Halter or Showmanship class included in this division) *Classes for Division – 81, 82, 83, 84, 93, 94, 95*

Hunter Hack Fence Height – ponies 13.2 & under 2'; ponies over 13.2 jump 2'3" & horses fence height is 2'6"

Low Hunter Fence Height –ponies 13.2 & under 2'; ponies over 13.2 jump 2'3" & horse fence height is 2'6"

Working Hunter Fence Height – ponies 12.2 & under 2"; ponies 12.2-13.2 jump 2'3"; ponies over 13.2 jump 2'6"; horses jump 3"

Driving – The open driving division is open to children drivers of any age. Gloves and whip are required for all drivers.

Must show in all 3 to qualify for division awards. (No Halter or Showmanship class included in this division) *Classes for Division – 44, 45, 46*

Miniature Horse –Open to riders of any age. *Classes for Division – 65, 67, 103, 114*

Gymkhana Division – This division is open to riders showing any seat. Choose either W/T or Canter division

Trot/Jog Gymkhana - Open to riders who are eligible for 10 & Under, Therapeutic or Novice divisions - classes 48, 51, 54, 57, 60

Gymkhana (Canter) - Open to riders who have the ability to canter – classes 49, 52, 55, 58, 61

Grand Prix Classes – In the tradition of the term Grand Prix, meaning “Grand Prize”, the Grand Prix classes will be judged upon the suitability of the mount to the rider, way of going of the horse/pony and equitation. These classes are being offered in lieu of stakes. Though money may not be awarded, prizes may be awarded in these classes. Riders may only show in **one** Grand Prix Class.

Members Only Opportunity Classes– Offered in good sportsmanship. This will enable riders a chance to work on a problem or provide an opportunity to try the next level of skill without interfering with the points in other divisions. The points for these classes will count for the year-end member division awards and overall year-end member top 10 awards.

Required documentation: This will save time at check in and provide a better opportunity for the show to start on time. Forms can be found on line.

Current Negative Coggins and proof of rabies vaccine -required to be on the show grounds. Once on file no need to resubmit.

Proof of membership or Membership application-complete with payment

Horse rider combination number registration -same number for the year and used to track yearend points

Horse / rider registration form Used to track day end division awards and payment.

Individual class registration slips are required. A full page of class registration slips is provided. To be cut apart at check in.

Series Day End and Year-end Awards

Series Day End High Point Division Awards – Competitors may show in:

One Pleasure division (See choices of Pleasure divisions in the chart above). Note: **no** cross entering into any other pleasure divisions.

One Gymkhana division (T/Jog or Canter).

Any of the Open divisions (Driving, Hunter, Cross Rails, Ranch Horse or Miniature Horse)

Points schedule: 1st Place= 6 points 2nd place = 5 points 3rd place = 4 points 4th place = 3 points 5th Place = 2 points 6th place = 1 point. Ties in a division will be determined by the most blue ribbons won, most red ribbons won through most green ribbons won respectively. Ties in Miniature Horse division will be determined by highest In Hand Trail score.

Series Year End High Point Division Awards - The riders, drivers or handler with the highest points from both shows will be the series division champion. The selection of division from the first show determines the year end division for the year-end series award.

WRC Year End Member Division Awards–WRC club members are eligible for one pleasure, one gymkhana and any of the appropriate open division awards. The points collected in classes entered in the selected division plus a point for every class entered is included for the divisional awards.

Opportunity class points are applied to these awards.

WRC Member Overall Top Ten Year End Awards – WRC club members have an opportunity to collect points for high point overall awards. Every point earned in every class entered in each of the WRC shows plus a point for every class enters on a single horse rider combination.

Membership: Forms can be found on the website and at the show office. Member points are kept on horse rider combination for each show. Points for Member awards count when the membership is submitted. Any points earned prior to submission will not count toward Member high point awards, so be sure to sign up before you show. All awards are given at the yearend banquet November 5th, 2016

Entry Fees:

Make checks payable to WRC. Any returned check for insufficient funds shall be charged \$30 fee.

Number Fee: All entries will be charged a \$2.00 number fee. A onetime number fee for each horse rider combination will be charged. Points will be tracked with this number. This number will be used for all WRC shows. This fee is not refundable. Rider is responsible for having the number on and for the condition of the number. If lost a replacement fee of \$2 will be charged.

Office Fee: A \$5 Office fee will be charged per horse/rider combination.

Grounds Fee: A \$5 Grounds fee will be applied to each entry except to 2015 WRC members. Proof of membership required. See website for membership information.

Pre-Entry Fee: \$6 per class. Pre-entries for Sept 17th & 18th show must be postmarked by 9/1. Only complete pre-entry forms postmarked on or before the indicated dates will be accepted at the pre-entry rate. Pre-entries must be paid in full. Incomplete entries will be returned to the competitor at check in and will be charged appropriately. Please be careful with your submissions. This discount is offered in order to help alleviate some of the congestion in the office on show day. Pre-entry fees will only be reimbursed with a doctors/vet excuse prior to the beginning of the show.

Post-Entry Fee: \$8.00 per class. Office opens at 7:30 please allow the office ample time to process entries.

Form two lines at registration **one** line for pre entry, **second** for day of show entry.

General Rules:

1. Signed waivers must be on file with the show secretary prior to schooling. Youth riders must have a signed waiver by parent or legal guardian in order to school or show. Back numbers must be worn at all times. **All ages as of 1/1/16**
2. Adding classes must be done a minimum of 2 classes in advance. Add forms must be used.
3. No refunds for scratched classes unless illness or injury to rider or equine.
4. Gymkhana Attire: Riders must wear long pants, shirt with sleeve (short sleeves acceptable – no tank tops) and riding shoe with heel. Show attire is expected for Pleasure divisions. Judge will not disqualify rider for lack of appointments.
5. Timed event: Riders must wait until the gate is closed to begin their run.
6. **Conduct Expectations of Competitors** - The WRC Show are meant to be a fun, family oriented and competitive environment for riders to demonstrate their horsemanship skills. Unsportsmanlike conduct will not be tolerated by competitors, trainers, parents and/or spectators. This includes but is not limited to the mishandling of an equine and unacceptable language. If unsportsmanlike conduct is observed, the competitor may be asked to leave the grounds and forfeit any and all entry fees. Trainers, parents and spectators displaying such behavior may be asked to vacate the premises.
7. Cancellation Of Classes – Under circumstances deemed unsafe by the show committee, a class may be postponed to a later date or cancelled.
