Nominated by Shelton Park Elementary School's Principal Tara Brewer, Sunny was surprised with her award after substituting for a recent physical education class, where her favorite activity of the day was running.

"While she's running alongside {the students}, she will mentor them, and ask about their grades and goals," Principal Brewer shared, adding that whenever they need something done, or someone {to help}, they know "Sunny will get it done".

As a retired Navy Storekeeper Master Chief with 21 years and a former NJROTC instructor in Virginia Beach and Norfolk, Sunny isn't slowing down. Her volunteer activities and part time work go beyond the gym floor.

She is an active member of MWAN Unit 152 and regularly volunteers as a Chaplain with the Virginia Beach Police Dept. and at Shelton Park Elementary when she isn't substitute teaching.

Additionally, she spends many hours

at her embroidery machine designing creations that support her expenses. Diagnosed with cancer some years ago, Sunny set a "bucket" goal to run 1,000 races. She will soon surpass number 900 with many of her races in support of, and including, local disabled children from Shelton Park. Surprised and humbled by this award, Sunny shared her philosophy of how she earned her nickname with Kurt Williams: "Every time you think you're having a bad day, there are 20 times as many people having a worse day than you are, so always think positive, think happy and help others along the way."

VA FINANCIAL SUPPLEMENT PROGRAM

In the August 2016 newsletter, Ruth Storck wrote about long term care for friends, family and even ourselves. I am sure many folks read her article and thought, "But how does one pay for it?" For those who qualify, the Department of Veterans' Affairs (DVA) has two financial supplement programs that may help with those expenses. One is for Veterans who have served on Active Duty during a period of war and the other is for survivors (widows & widowers) of those Veterans.

There are financial criteria – income and net worth – that must be met but many will qualify because their income is effectively "offset" by regularly recurring medical expenses such as in-home care, assisted living facility or nursing home residence. I am a retired Veterans' Benefits Counselor (Service Officer) with the Arizona Department of Veterans' Services and the American Legion. I have and still do offer assistance to those seeking this benefit.

Every state has Service Officers to assist veterans in applying for these and other benefits. To locate a Service Officer near you, visit the National Veterans Foundation online at nvf.org/veteran-service-officers.

If you do not use a computer, then you may call the Foundation at 1-888-777-4443. Those listed on the website and/or referred by phone are accredited by the DVA and their services are FREE. (Continue **Supplement** on page 3)

This bulletin contains the MWAN 2017 Scholarship Application on pages 4 & 5.

Originally approved at the 2000 National Convention in Cleveland, Ohio, this is one small way our membership helps young people with the ever-rising cost of tuition and books, while encouraging them to learn about the military women who have served – and continue to serve – our nation.

According to the National Center for Education Statistics (http://nces.ed.gov/) estimates for the 2013-2014 academic year for undergraduate tuition, fees, room and board were \$15,640 at public institutions. This is 34 percent higher than the same costs 10 years earlier.

We had previously raised the scholarship we award to \$1,500 but in 2015 it was dropped back to the original \$1,000 figure due to low funding.

Please share our scholarship application with everyone who may be eligible. Pass a copy on to other Veteran Organizations in your community for them to share with their military women.

Also, consider an end-of-the-year, tax-exempt donation to the MWAN Scholarship fund. You could include a few extra dollars when paying your 2017 National Dues. Just make certain you include a note so our National Treasurer will know the extra money is for the Scholarship Fund.



PopSockets "pop" whenever you need a grip, a stand, a headset management system or just something to play with. PopSockets attach to most phones, cases, and tablets. They are easily removable without residue, and can be repositioned over and over. They are designed to expand and collapse 12,000 times!

Supplement (Continued from page 1) Most of the forms required to apply for the programs mentioned above are available online at va.gov. For a Veteran to apply the forms needed are VAF 21-527EZ, 21-2680, and the Care Expense Statement (CES). For the surviving spouse to apply the forms needed are VAFs 21-534EZ, 21-2680 and the CES.

The CES is not available online. However, a "Pension claim package" may be requested from the Service Officer you contact and can be mailed to you. The Service Officer can also advise on where to submit the completed package and other important information. Since a copy of the qualifying Veteran's DD214 or other Discharge Document is required, the Service Officers can also help to obtain that.

Please share this information! This is a benefit that was earned by one's honorable service so if you meet the criterion and need financial help, APPLY ASAP.

Ghost Veterans

You see a gathering of people who are all wearing American Legion covers and right away you recognize they are an elite group of our nation's veterans. It doesn't matter what branch of service they served, the fact they all signed and promised to defend this nation with the price of their lives if need be, makes them all super heroes! You walk up to the group, shake each one's hand while thanking them for their service, except for the ghost veterans, then you walk away feeling good inside that you were able to thank those veterans.

The ghosts stand shoulder to shoulder with the other veterans, wearing the same uniforms, yet are not seen by the public. They are overlooked more times than recognized. Usually, it takes a ghost to see another ghost, and it takes a ghost to explain to others - including veterans - why ghosts even exist.

If you haven't figured out by now who the ghosts are, don't feel alone. It is only when they are specifically pointed out that they are truly seen. I want to point out for all to see, our female veterans are ghosts or invisible to many. Although we served and stand amongst our brothers, we are more times than not overlooked, mistaken for one of our brothers' wives, or just plain ignored.

On Veterans Day this year, my husband and I went to dinner and the waitress acknowledged his service because he was ordering off a special veteran's menu. When he told her I was also a veteran, she wanted to see proof of my service. I was hurt by her actions, but I was able to show her my veteran status on my Missouri Driver's license. I thank the state for allowing this status to be placed on an official document.

Our ranks are fewer than our male counterparts, but Women Are Veterans, Too! So the next time you see females amongst a group of male veterans, please don't skip them when shaking hands, acknowledge their service and sacrifice. If you're a veteran and you see ghost veterans, please stand up for them. Most likely they won't say anything to the people making them ghosts, but with a few words from you, you can help educate others and make ghost veterans disappear.

Military Women Across the Nation College Scholarship Rules & Application



This \$1,000 scholarship is available to a relative - male or female - of a military woman.

The 2017 essay topic is "Military Women Around the World".

Applicants shall select a U.S. military service or branch such as aviation, medical, supply, etc. and compare the service of U.S. military women to the similar service of military women in at least one other country's military.

A few Ideas include, but are not limited to: Women on submarines – U.S. & Norway; Women fighter pilots – U.S. & United Arab Emirates; Universal Conscription/Draft – U.S. & Israel; Women on Surface Ships – U.S. & Japan, etc.

PLEASE FOLLOW THE RULES

Previous applicants have been disqualified simply because they did not follow the rules.

Applicant Eligibility

- 1. Applicants may be female or male but must be a civilian relative of a Military Woman who has served or is serving honorably in the U.S. Army, Navy, Marine Corps, Air Force or Coast Guard or their Guard or Reserve components. The relationship may be by birth, legal adoption or marriage.
- 2. Applicants must have a 3.2 or better Grade Point Average (GPA) on a 4.0 scale.
- 3. Applicants must be a high school senior or undergraduate college student.
- 4. Entries must be submitted by March 3, 2017: NO EXCEPTIONS.
- 5. This scholarship is NOT for military women or veterans.

Application Package MUST INCLUDE the following:

- 1. Completed Application.
- 2. Copy of all transcripts pertaining to current course of study to include academic standing.
- 3. **Documented Proof of the military woman relative's honorable military service**. Application packages without this proof **WILL NOT be considered**. **Documented Proof** is a legible copy of the military woman's Standard Form DD-214 discharge certificate **OR** a Statement of Service on letterhead from an Active Serving military woman's command.

NOTE: To protect personal information applicants are directed to mark out all references to social security and/or service numbers on the DD-214 and high school or college transcripts.

- 4. An essay of 1,000 to 1,500 words in length written on the 2017 topic. The essay must be the applicants own work; be submitted in .doc or .docx format, and include documented evidence of both research and an interview with at least one military woman. (The interviewee does not need to be the qualifying relative.) Applicants are encouraged to contact military women in recruiting offices, at military bases, reserve units, etc. to enhance the research.
- 5. The entire Application Package shall be submitted in one email to include separate attachments for the following:
 - (1) Completed Application
 - (2) Transcripts (must be legible)
 - (3) Military Woman Relative Proof of Eligibility
 - (4) Applicant's essay (in .doc or .docx format)

Each attached file must include the applicant's last name and first initial as part of the file name and ALL correspondence must include the applicant's name in the subject line.

Application Package Submission DEADLINE is March 3, 2017

Applicants will be notified in June 2017 of the results.

The scholarship will be paid jointly to the scholarship recipient AND his/her college.
