

"Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ." Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus

Christ, who has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places, just as he chose us in Christ before the foundation of the world to be holy and blameless before him in love." Ephesians 1: 2-4.

How grateful we are to be blessed by God, in love! We are blessed to live each day, knowing that God walks with us in times of difficulty and in times of joy. It makes me think about the Old Testament scripture in Ecclesiastes 3:1-8. Pick up your Bible and read it again. Consider looking up different translations when you are reading Ecclesiastes. stand what the scripture is saying more clearly. Did you know the word "time" is repeated 29 times! Listen to the rhythm of the sum of the words. We

are born...and we die, plant... and are plucked up, we weep...and then laugh, we mourn...and we dance, we keep silence...and then we speak, ending with love...and hate, and war...and peace.

At some time or another, we all run into the reality of life. Everything that is part of

those eight verses of Ecclesiastes ends up being something we experience. Whether we are rejoicing the coming of a newborn child or being accepted into the college we wanted, others may be grieving the loss of a loved one. Either way, we can be assured that the Holy Spirit stays with us and guides us.

Sometimes we are not sure what God wants us to do. Rather than being frustrated and angry, we eventually remember that God has called us to reach out, to pray if not in words, let God make sense of your needs. When you are struggling, stop and listen. I do not know about you, but oftentimes, it takes a reminder to listen before I am ready to let go of the way I think things should go.

That applies even with our frustration about having to do things different ways than we had always done. Recently, as we have been coming out of the fog of Covid, it seems that in almost anything we are doing, there is a reminder that as humans, we have to let go of things that we want to hold on tight, so we can make room to what God has in store for us.

CPC is part of the "Youth Summer Lunch Program." We were not able to participate last year. This year, it is the first time we were able to host at the church. We are all loving the idea that we do not

have to carry the boxes to and from the site! However, we have learned some valuable things. It never occurred to us that the youth might not know where Community Presbyterian Church is or


come to 'our' church. We now take the carts to the sidewalk so children are able to participate in the food program, regardless of their religious beliefs.




