As most of you know, the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church (USA) is meeting in St. Louis this month at the Americas Center. The meeting will be begin on Saturday, June 16 and adjourn on Saturday, June 23.

General Assembly in St. Louis affects us in several ways. First of all, local churches were asked to host GA commissioners for Sunday worship on June 17. Along with the Pendo Presbyterian Church (the Kenyans), we heard the call. On Sunday, June 17th, twenty commissioners from the 223rd General Assembly will attend our worship service. The service will feature participation from the Pendo Presbyterian Church; Pastor Isaac Wanyoike and the Pendo Choir will sing. Following the service, a lunch will be served in Fellowship Hall.

God of the journey, we remember that Mary and Joseph had to flee to Egypt, taking Jesus to safety, leaving home behind. GA223: STL Mission Tours

Friday, June 15th

(\$76) Mission Tour: Intro to the Gateway City— Architecture, the Arch, BBO & Riverboat Ride Capture the essence of St. Louis in this introduction to the Gateway City. You will see Eads Bridge, America's first steeltruss bridge, spanning the Mississippi River from Missouri to Illinois. As you pass through downtown, you will see an extensive array of unique architectural designs, many on the National Register of Historic Places. Marvel at the 630-foot Gateway Arch, designed by architect Eero Saarinen as a tribute to the westward expansion of the U.S. A tram ride to the top of the Arch is sure to be the highlight of your morning! A savory BBQ buffet lunch at Pappy's Smokehouse is included. Your tour wraps up with an afternoon Mississippi riverboat ride. No on-site registration. Boarding begins at 8:45 AM.

(\$55) Mission Tour: Cathedrals of St. Louis Beautiful cathedrals have played an integral part of the history of St. Louis. You will visit three inspiring cathedrals—the Old Cathedral, Christ Church Cathedral and the Cathedral Basilica on this tour. The Old Cathedral, dedicated in 1834 and the first cathedral west of the Mississippi, remains in use today. Be inspired by splendid stained glass windows and the Reredos, the sculpted wall rising 35 feet behind the altar of the Episcopalian Christ Church Cathedral, a National Historic Landmark. Inside the Cathedral Basilica, the city's New Cathedral and home of the St. Louis Archdiocese, you will be awed by one of the largest collections of mosaics in the world, with 84,000 square feet of tiny pieces of tile and glass. A tasty Italian lunch at Zia's on The Hill, the Italian-American neighborhood, is included. Boarding begins at 9:15 AM.

(\$21) Mission Tour: Pack Food Boxes for Operation Food Search (feeds 200,000/mo.)
Our group will sort food into boxes that get picked up for distribution to families in 31 counties in Missouri, Illinois, and St. Louis City. Wear comfortable clothing. No open-toed shoes. Bring your own water bottle to refill onsite. Boarding begins at 8:45 AM. (18+ only)

(\$33) Mission Tour: Cahokia Mounds UNESCO World Heritage Site Tour

Within the 2,200-acre tract lie the archaeological remnants of the central section of the ancient settlement, which once consisted of nearly 120 mounds of various descriptions and used for a variety of functions. Your tour will take you through the Interpretative Center, then outdoors, where you can walk among the archeological finds and maybe even hike Monks Mound, the largest Pre-Columbian earthwork in the Americas and the largest pyramid north of Mesoamerica. Wear comfortable shoes for lots of walking. Boarding begins at 12:45 PM.

(\$63) Mission Tour: Historic Ste. Genevieve Tour & Tasting at Chaumette Winery Located about an hour south of St. Louis is the quaint Missouri town of Ste. Genevieve, founded in 1735 by French immigrants as the first European settlement west of the Mississippi. Your guide will take you to many of the remarkable restorations of pre-American buildings, pointing out important historic locations such as the Felix Valle House and the Louis Bolduc House, the first building in Ste. Genevieve to be authentically restored. Relax in the afternoon at Chaumette Winery, where you can take in breathtaking views of the countryside while sampling some of their awardwinning wines. A tasty lunch served by First Presbyterian Church, Ste. Genevieve is included. Must be 21 yrs. old. Boarding begins at 9:45 AM.
