

January is National Blood Donor Month and

Legionnaires everywhere are encouraged to give blood and host blood drives at Posts as part of the American Legion Blood Donor Program a program that has existed since 1946 to help a life-saving cause that becomes even more important during the harsh winter months.

Posts and Departments that donate the most blood are honored at the National Convention in August each year. Departments are recognized in two areas: for Post participation and individual Legionnaire participation. The National Commander presents both awards at the National Convention. If you decide to donate blood at a blood drive or anywhere during this coming year, please inform our Commander or Adjutant so that your donation can be included in our Consolidated Post Report and we can receive credit for our Post and Department.

It's easy to request your military service records from the National Personnel Records Center (NPRC) online, by mail, or by fax.

Includes DD 214 separation documents, personnel records, replacement medals, and/or medical records. Just go to: www.archives.gov/veterans/military-service-records and follow the instructions. Same day service may be available for emergency requests (for example, medical procedures or funerals).

Generally there is no charge for basic military records provided to veterans, next-of-kin and authorized representatives from Federal (non-archival) records. If your request involves a service fee, you will be notified as soon as that determination is made. However, archival Official Military Personnel Files (OMPF) are subject to the NARA fee schedule that authorizes the Agency to collect fees from the public for copies of archival records (44 USC 2116c and 44 USC 2307).

A routine OMPF of 5 pages or less: \$25 flat fee A routine OMPF of 6 pages or more: \$70 flat fee (most OMPFs fall in this category)

Response time for records requested from the NPRC varies. While the NPRC works actively to respond to each request in a timely fashion, the Center receives approximately 4,000 - 5,000 requests per day. They are responding to requests for separation documents within 10 days about 92% of the time. However, requests that involve reconstruction efforts due to the 1973 fire, or older records which require extensive search efforts, may take 6 months or more to complete.

We know how hard it is to remember everything you need to take care of when a loved one passes away, and even harder to know what benefits a deceased veteran may be entitled to.

This is one reason why the American Legion has Service Officers, to help the deceased veteran and his or her family receive all the benefits they are entitled to. Always remember, and tell your loved ones -

- 1) Know where your DD-214 is. An American Legion service officer can help you get a replacement copy if lost. Also see above.
- 2) Tell your funeral director that the deceased was a veteran.
- 3) Contact your Post (or the nearest American Legion Post if your loved one was not a member), and not only can you receive the help of a Service Officer but, the Post's Honor Guard can help with a military funeral service. Other benefits might include a free burial plot, headstone, survivor benefits, burial expenses, and an American flag to drape the casket.




