Philosophy and Distinctives:

Pine Springs Camp Philosophy:

The Pine Springs Camp summer program desires that each camper vitally encounters Christ. We do this by... Teaching about the unconditional love of Christ and emphasizing that each camper has unique and creative gifts that God has given them. We offer a variety of camps so that each participant can explore and develop their gifts and grow in their relationship to God.

Modeling a proper way to celebrate and play in God's creation. We believe that camp should be fun! Experiencing the importance of being involved in Christian community.

Pine Springs Camp Distinctives:

We help campers meet and learn about Jesus Christ through a number of DISTINCTIVES that make Pine Springs Camp unique:

Bible Interactions - Pine Springs Camp recognizes the importance of God's Word in everyday life which is why each camp spends time daily interacting with the Bible in unique and non-traditional ways. The following represent some of the ways campers have gained unique perspectives on the Bible and its message:

- 1. Reading the story of creation and expressing personal impressions of the creation story through art, helping campers internalize the creativity of God;
- 2. Setting up and packing up tents to understand what Abraham went through every time God told him to move, helping campers understand the faith and energy it takes to follow hard after God.

Small Group Environment- Pine Springs Camp offers the best of both worlds - a large, high-energy camp atmosphere with a small group environment. PSC offers many different camps every week. Each camp contains a smaller number of campers that receive individual attention from counselors and Directors and get to know other campers better in a small group environment, even though each camp is part of a larger, high-energy camp experience.

Small Camper to Counselor Ratio - Pine Springs Camp recognizes the need for each camper to receive personal attention throughout the week. With a 6:1 camper to counselor ratio, PSC ensures that your child will get to know his/her counselor in a meaningful way and have the opportunity to hear what God is doing in the counselor's life.

Emphasis on enjoying creation and personal God-given abilities - Pine Springs Camp is a place to enjoy creation and other people and recognize God-given abilities. The PSC camp atmosphere emphasizes playfulness and good sportsmanship.

Choice - Pine Springs Camp offers many options so that campers can explore their unique interests and abilities. Camps are divided into the following categories: adventure, wet-n-wild, elective and specialty.



Crew leaders: They are responsible for taking a group of 5-8 children from station to station. You do not have to teach, just talk with the children in your group, get to know the kids and love them!

Station leaders/helpers: They stay in one place and are responsible for teaching one particular thing, such as our Science experiments and Crafts area (All materials and lessons are provided!), or the Bible Story telling helper-who is responsible to find and make sure that all props and items needed for the person telling the story are in the room and ready for use each day, or the Snack crew-helping to prepare the snack so it's ready to serve when the children arrive.

Nursery Care: This 2 person group is responsible to care for any children (younger than 3 yrs. of age) whose parent is helping during VBS. This takes place in the cry room in the sanctuary.

Decorator: These people would work with others already working on decorating to transform the sanctuary and hallways as well as the Bible Story room into an underwater home for the week of Bible School.

Donation Board Manager: This 1-2 person group is responsible to create the donation board, and manage the collection of all the items that come in so we know what still needs to be purchased and what we have. This is done prior to VBS starting and does not require you to be at VBS. (There is a template you can use and help is available if you'd like it!)

The "Whatever is Needed" job: This 1-2 person group is willing to show up the first two nights or VBS and is very willing to just be "around." They understand that they might be asked to serve as a crew leader, or maybe just asked to be a "runner" finding people, or relaying messages, or maybe not need to do a lot. This person or group is not out in front of people but is very important to have when those unexpected situations arise!

The Greeter: This 1-2 person group is asked to welcome parents as they drop their child off for VBS and answer any questions they might have about where their child goes, or other VBS questions. This person should be very comfortable talking with people and their children and making them feel at home with us!

Confirmation (in the Christian Church) refers to the rite at which a baptized person, especially one baptized as an infant, affirms his or her Christian belief and is admitted as a full member of the church. It is the moment a youth takes ownership of his or her own faith journey. In Redstone Presbytery, we are blessed to have Pine Springs Camp, which holds a special confirmation retreat in April each year. On a snowy April weekend, approximately 12 youth and adults made the trek up to PSC to learn about the Presbyterian Church and each other.

Taylor Barner, is an M.Div. student at Pittsburgh Theological Seminary and candidate for ordained ministry in Redstone Presbytery.
