Enjoy the anticipation, hope and peace of this Advent and Christmas season!



Greetings Trinity Lutheran Church Family!

I thought for my December Newsletter, I could offer you something to use as an Advent devotion. We rejoice together, as we begin this Advent Season. We join those throughout salvation history who waited in great anticipation for the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, Immanuel, God with us! God gave the magi a bright star as a sign, pointing to the location and coming of the newborn Savior Jesus Christ. We know this Christmas narrative well and cherish hearing it every year from God's living and eternal Word.

Before the Magi, God gave His Word as a sign through the Prophet Isaiah:

"...the Lord himself will give you a sign. Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and shall call his name Immanuel" (Isaiah 7:14).

"For to us a child is born, to us a son is given; and the government shall be upon his shoulder, and his name shall be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace" (Isaiah 9:6).

The Gospel teaches us Jesus is the direct fulfillment of these prophecies:

"She will bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins. All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had spoken through the prophet: 'Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall call his name Immanuel,' which means, God with us" (Matthew 1:21-23).

As we focus on the coming of Christ this Advent and Christmas seasons, let's also remember that Jesus not only came as promised, but comes, and will come again. He's the true gift that keeps on giving! Jesus taught us to know and trust in His real presence:

"Behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age" (Matthew 28:20).

He gives us the gift of His real presence as promised; in His Word and Sacraments in the Divine Service – where He's still Immanuel, *God with us*. He gives us the <u>physical elements</u> in the sacraments (which faith can grasp onto). Water in Baptism, and the bread and the wine in the Lord's Supper. Yet, more than that He gives us <u>supernatural elements</u>, the Holy Spirit in His Word working and sustaining faith, the forgiveness of sins, and the promise of eternal life.

God sent His Son to be born in an <u>ordinary place</u> (that Bethlehem stable), He consecrates ordinary means to <u>accomplish</u> <u>the extraordinary</u> for our salvation! The location and office for the newborn King was foretold by yet another prophet, finding its fulfillment in Jesus, born in Bethlehem:

"But you, O Bethlehem Ephrathah, who are too little to be among the clans of Judah, from you shall come forth for me one who is to be ruler in Israel, whose coming forth is from of old, from ancient days" (Micah 5:2).

"And he shall stand and shepherd his flock in the strength of the LORD, in the majesty of the name of the LORD his God. And they shall dwell secure, for now he shall be great to the ends of the earth. And he shall be their peace" (Micah 5:4-5a).

God used world history and secular powers to bring Joseph and Mary to Bethlehem at just the right time and place to fulfill the scriptures, traveling from Nazareth to Bethlehem for a government mandated census:

"In those days a decree went out from Caesar Augustus that all the world should be registered" (Luke 2:1).

"And Joseph also went up from Galilee, from the town of Nazareth, to Judea, to the city of David, which is called Bethlehem, because he was of the house and lineage of David, to be registered with Mary, his betrothed, who was with child" (Luke 2:4-5).



We often wonder what is going on in this world because of the ever-changing secular things occurring. What's God doing? I'm sure Joseph and Mary thought the same things at times. Rest assured; some things don't change. God always has and always will make sure that history unfolds to ultimately serve His good and gracious will. After all, He was faithful to His promises given as signs in His Word through the prophets, in bringing the promised Holy One of Israel; the Lord Jesus Christ; Immanuel, God with us.

God was faithful to His promises in the Old Testament, and we know we can also trust His promises made through Christ and His Apostles in the New Testament. As promised, God came for our salvation. He also comes to us now and will come again on the last day to take us home!

My prayer for you this Advent and Christmas Season, is that all your gatherings, celebrations, festivities, and travels will be blessed. That Christ will be at the center of it all, and that we can continue to worship the King together in Peace here at Trinity Lutheran Church! God's blessing on your Advent and Christmas Seasons!
