**WEATHER SYNOPSIS FOR MAY AND JUNE, 2017**

**As we move through May and June:**

- **temperatures at night will rise to above freezing, and day time temperatures will get up into the range of 10 to 20 degrees C (50 to 59 degrees F); and**
- **Precipitation will decline, and the snowpack (except for glaciers) will slowly melt, leaving some year round snow patches (yes, we have skied on them!).**
- **The spring water run off will get into high gear. We have a large number of creeks and waterfalls in our tenure, and they will all be putting on their usual spectacular show.**

**WEATHER HIGHLIGHTS FROM WINTER 2016/2017**

**Once again, our location was blessed with regular snowfalls created by the confluence of (1) moist/warm Pacific air moving towards us from the west and (2) the cold air mass that hovers over the Columbia Icefields which are near us to the south. We chose this location, in part, because of this weather characteristic. We had great skiing & snowboarding throughout the season.**

**Over all, the snowpack and weather were pretty normal and allowed this range of activities.**

- **From the Lodge at 1,921 metres (6,400 ft) elevation, we skied to a highest elevation of 2,520 metres (8,391 ft) and to a lowest elevation of 1,640 metres (5,461 ft), giving us a total elevation range of 880 metres (2,930 ft).**
- **Most skiing was concentrated on northerly and easterly aspects, but when the weather and snow conditions were right we enjoyed southerly and westerly aspects as well.**
- **Most skiing was in the Mallard Valley where the Lodge is located, but we had many days in the Simpson Valley to the west, and the Whirlpool Valley to the east.**
