Abstracts will not appear as a printed supplement to the program book. Instead, abstract printing stations will be located throughout the Hawaii Convention Center.

Weather

August weather in Honolulu is hot and sunny with isolated showers. Average high temperatures reach 88°F/31°C with lows of 73°F/23°C. Be sure to dress appropriately for both the indoors and outdoors, and don't forget a light jacket or sweater.

TRANSPORTATION

Airport Transportation

The Honolulu International Airport is conveniently located 9 miles (14.4 km) west of Waikiki Beach, 4 miles (6.4 km) west of Central Honolulu and 7.5 miles (12 km) west of the Hawaii Convention Center.

There are several options to choose from for shuttle services from the Honolulu airport to the hotels. Advance registration for shuttles is not required. Average one-way taxi pricing from the airport to the Hilton Hawaiian Village or the Doubletree Hotel is approximately \$30.

Transportation in Honolulu

Honolulu is a very walkable city, however taxi cabs are available throughout the city and at many of the hotels. To really experience all that Hawaii offers, you should consider renting a car. Many visitors also enjoy taking bus tours to conveniently explore the island.
