STORMWATER POLLUTION PREVENTIVE MEASURES

Stormwater runoff is generated from many different land surfaces and is impacted by the behaviors and activities of individuals, households, and the public.

These common individual behaviors have the potential to generate stormwater pollution including:

- ◆ Littering
- ◆ Disposing of trash and recyclables
- ◆ Disposing of pet-waste
- ◆ Applying lawn-chemicals
- ◆ Washing cars
- ◆ Changing motor-oil, and disposing leftover paint and household chemicals

Some tips on how to improve the activities listed above that affect stormwater:

- ◆ NEVER litter and place all trash in the proper receptacle
- ◆ Place all trash in a receptacle and/or proper recycling bin when possible
- ◆ Always clean up pet waste (do not allow to sit for a long period of time)
- ◆ Use organic fertilizer and reduce or eliminate chemicals when possible
- ◆ Make sure water run-off does not run into a storm drain. If you are not sure, then take your vehicle to a car wash as they adhere to EPA regulations
- ◆ Make sure chemicals do not run into a storm drain. Clean up all spills and dispose of unused chemicals properly (do NOT empty chemicals down the sink or storm drain)
