

Awake thou that sleepest, and arise from the dead, and the Christ shall give thee light. Eph. 5:14. Surely with joyful hearts we praise Him, our risen Christ. He is the first fruits of the resurrection. I Cor. 15:20. Every man in his own order shall come forth, but Christ is the first. I Cor. 15:23. "Stand in awe, and sin not," are the words of David. Psa. 4:4. He looked forward to this time of the resurrection with full assurance, saying, 'As for me, I will behold thy face in righteousness: I shall be satisfied, when I awake, with thy likeness." Psa. 17:15. It is because of the resurrection after the three days in the tomb that this hope of life beyond the grave lives, still brightly shining.

This glad Easter morn, we awake, to worship in spirit and truth the risen Christ, the Christ of the Cross, our Christ! We speak freely in this possessive term because He lives in our hearts by faith. Although He is the King of Glory, He reaches down with all-power to all men with a hand of mercy and hope. The sinner is justified, the sick healed, the distressed comforted, and prayer answered. All holy men give praise to Him, the Lamb of God, who meets men to lift the curse, bring

a blessing and answer the cry of every hungry heart. In this life He is the satisfying portion, and beyond, through the promise of the resurrection, the greatest hope of man-kind. It is the one thing that bridges death, with consolation, when no other light burns. Despair is tragic, however hope makes sure the testimony of the Lord. The dead in Christ are called blessed, because they rest, and their labors follow them. Rev. 14:13. The greatest achievement of this life is to make our calling and election sure, II Pet. 1:10, that is to have a faith in God that will lead to salvation by repentance, and to a walk in holiness through the door of sanctification. This may be reached by consecrating our lives to God. With the witness to these works we may readily tarry for the Baptism of the Holy Ghost, with the evidence of Speaking in other tongues. To ask of the Lord is pleasing to the Father, and a deep experience in Christ should be our goal, so that our hope in the first resurrection will be more pronounced. "Because I live, ye shall live also," is the words of our Christ. John 14:19. There in a time of prayer the night of sin passes, the yoke of bondage is broken and praises from a new life roll forth. The things of this earth are dead or dying, and it does no good to seek life from its resources. The dead must bury the dead. For us there still remains this hope, we must seek the Living Christ. He is not in the tomb. He is not here, He is risen. We go not to an empty tomb in old Judea, nor stand by the shores of Palestine looking for His returning figure, but look upward to the heavens where He sits as the resurrected Christ. Some day every head shall bow, every knee will bend, and every tongue confess that Christ is Christ. The witnesses of the past left this testimony that the grave could not hold Christ, neither will it restrain them that now sleep in Christ, but at the appointed time they shall come forth. In a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trump: for the trumpet shall sound, and the dead shall be raised incorruptible, and we shall be changed. I Cor. 15:53. An army countless for number will be there. Rev. 5:11. Faithful souls of all ages will meet on that glad morning, and testify of the well established fact that it pays to serve Jesus, that He is the MES-SIAH and Prince of every age and "O death, where is thy sting? O grave, where is thy victory?" I Cor. 15:55. will be the greatest theme of victory ever sung.

Redemption through the precious Blood of Christ, no doubt, will be the subject. Rev. 5:9.


He speaks to me this Easter morning, the Christ I love so much. It reminds me of the journey the two took over the lonely mountain road from Jerusalem to Emmaus right after Jesus was resurrected. They were not noted men, yet Jesus conversed with them. We may not be prominent, or rich, or even specially talented, yet Christ will walk with us too, for He is no respector of persons. To know Him, is to love Him. As first these two knew Him not, yet as He unfolded the Scriptures, they rejoiced and felt the warmth of His words. They were full of assurance and blessings. when Jesus revealed Himself to them, and had gone His way, they commented. Did not our hearts burn within us? That fire and fulness of heart may be felt again each day as our heart communes with God and His spirit envelops us in tender care and expressive love. We are not alone. Christ is with us. By faith in the resurrection we have a seal or pledge whereby we call beyond the tomb with a holy understanding.

It is not always easy, especially in trial to believe in the resurrection, as it proved in the case of Thomas. From the other disciples he learned, "We have seen the Lord." The reply of Thomas was, Except I shall see in His hands the print of the nails, and put my finger into the print of the nails, and put my hand into His side, I will not believe. John 20: 25. The Christ that is not willing that any should perish-came to Thomas in such a manner that he exclaimed My Lord and my God! He was told not to be faithless, but believing, and upon his acknowledgment, comforted with the assurance that, "Blessed are they that believe." Christ can make His presence known to each one that will call upon Him. The world is left in darkness through its own desire to serve sin and reject righteousness. Precious Bible truths have been attested by men of all ages, however the foundation of God standeth sure. This

Easter will be more than just another day or church festival, it will pass from deadness to a living cherished memorial with a holy meaning when Jesus becomes real to you. The fear of death and the dread of the tomb will loose their grip, and the resurrection will bring new hope. I am the resurrection and the life, were the words of Christ.

My admonition to all men is that they might have faith in God, belief in His word, and love one for another, so that they may grow in grace and in the fulness of Christ — these attributes build firm a Christian Character that serves well the cause of Christ, and sets apart a holy people, that someday will be the fruit of the resur-

rection, the Blessed and holy dead. There is a second resurrection one thousand years later wherein all the dead will come forth to face the judgment. Some to life some to be lost. Let us make sure our election and calling so that we come behind in no gift. Praise God for His plan of salvation, Christ gave His life, but in that He lives, He lives to intercede, so that this Easter we pause to thank Him for life, for a more abundant life, and in the hereafter eternal life. Christ came in the power of an endless life, and this life He gave to all. Heb. 7:16. The sum of it all are found in the words of Paul, The life which I now live in the flesh I live by the faith of the Son of God. Gal. 2:20.

Jesus gave His side to the spear.



"The Dangers of Compromising"

One of the most outstanding signs of the last days and "falling away" times in which we now live is the widespread and wholesale compromising by professing Christians with liberalism and anti-fundamental un-Scriptural lies. This prelude to apostacy and "Modern" anti-God's-word force has been gathering increasing momentum at an alarming rate in recent years the world over. Man's worthless word is replacing God's eternal Word of life with diabolical cunning and audacity. People in great numbers are being "turned unto fables" and God-defying lies, preferring darkness to light, which is a sure indication of the withdrawal of Holy Ghost conviction upon the hearts and lives of unbelievers and former Christians. Decadent churchianity is devoid of a live Gospel message, being only full of words, "social gospel," adulterated half-truths, and sleep-inducing, men-pleasing platitudes given out by "blind leaders of the blind." The sure proof of this fact lies in the ridiculing and ignoring attitude toward Christ's second coming. If it is touched upon at all, the attitude of utter unconcern is, "My Lord delayeth His coming" (we hope), as in Matt. 24; and He 'shall come in a day when he looketh NOT for Him, and in an hour that he is NOT AWARE OF;" and what will be their fate? He "shall cut him asunder, and appoint him his portion with the hypocrites; there shall be weeping and gnashing of teeth." (Read the whole timely chapter.) "Behold, I come QUICKLY: hold that fast which thou hast, that no MAN take thy crown." Rev. 3:11.

In any business enterprise when the END of the pre-determined accounting period approaches, stock is taken of all the goods on hand, and debts totaled in order to determine exactly what the business is worth, plus or minus any losses or gains for the period. When His time of accounting comes for each one of us, are we going to be "weighed" on God's Balance Sheet and be found wanting? There is

no insurance available covering spiritual bankruptcy, no getting 'out of the red" with promissory notes to the Lord. We may fool ourselves, even vigorously support man-made institutions which encourage self-satisfying compromises and administer consciencebalm on Sunday, but only succeed in remaining in the "congregation of the dead" and being a liability to God's will and purpose, worth exactly nothing to Him. He knows just what we are worth TODAY.

You will recall that five of the seven Churches in Rev. 2 were charged to "REPENT." Jesus didn't waste a word in these terse, concentrated messages, given not to unbelievers and sinners but to the "Seven Churches." Did He compromise with worldliness, ritual, man's false "dignity" and "All-this-and-heaven-too" manner of living? NO! He strongly reprimanded these man-made, God-condemned compromises, using such phrases as "... which thing I HATE"—Rev. 2:15. Never-changing God will not tolerate sin in any form. Man's unstable and corrupt "new concepts" of God's word are only souldamning subtleties of Satan substituted for "The Way," which necessitates separation of heart and life. Jesus said, "I am THE way, THE truth, and THE life," singular, eliminating all other manmade ways, regardless of how broad.

When the "rock," Peter, momentarily erred, Jesus exclaimed: "Get thee behind me, Satan; thou art an offense unto Me; for thou savorest not the things that be of GOD, but those that be of MEN." Matt. 16:23.

Adulterated truth is the most dangerous poison of all, much more so than obvious, out and out lies. The element of deception is cleverly concealed within a supporting but distorted Scriptural truth. "Howbeit when He, the Spirit of truth is come, HE will guide you into ALL truth." John 16:13A. Man asserts of himself, "Man is man, and who is

more?" But God's word says, 'Cease ye from MAN, whose breath is in his nostrels: for wherein is he to be accounted of?" Isa. 2:22. Go back to the first chapter of Isaiah, a striking picture of today. A purging judgment fell upon these sin-compromising, ritual-trusting, man-deceived victims of their own folly, and the heartrepentent remnant alone spared, while the others were de-

stroyed.

Even though we were not living in the end time (which is so evident that even "liberal" writers are now admitting it) life is uncertain and transitory at best. The dangers of wilfully or even unconsciously compromising with cunning adulterations of God's word beset us from every side. Let us examine ourselves in "spiritual introspection" with the searchlight of His all-revealing Word of life to see how we measure up TO-DAY. " . . . I am He which searcheth the reins and hearts . . .

Rev. 2:23.

'Now the Spirit speaketh expressly, that in the latter times some shall depart from the faith, giving heed to seducing spirits, and doctrines of devils . . . Take heed unto thyself, and unto the doctrine; continue in them; for in doing this thou shalt both save thyself, and them that hear thee. I Tim. 4:1 and 16. "If any MAN teach otherwise, and consent not to wholesome words, even the words of our Lord Jesus Christ, and to the doctrine which is according to Godliness, he is proud, KNOW-ING NOTHING . . . Perverse disputings of men of corrupt minds, and destitute of the truth . . . " I Tim. 6:3-5.

Behold. He cometh clouds: and every eye shall see Him, and they also which pierced Him; and all kindreds of the earth shall wail because of Him. Even so, amen." Rev. 1:7.

THE CHAPLAINS CORPS

There were 81,000 chaplains in the American armed services during World War II. One out of every four won a decoration for valor or meritorius service; one out of every twenty received the Purple Heart; 84 were killed in action; and, in spite of regulations forbidding their accompanying air combat teams, ten won air medals. Next to the Infantry and Air Corps, the Chaplains Corps had the highest casualty rate in the Army.

MORE WITHOUT CHRIST

"There are actually more men, women and children without Christ today than there have ever been before," says Dr. K. S. Latourette. "In almost all countries where foreign mission work is carried on, although the rate of growth of the Christian community is higher than the rate of growth of the general population, the immensely greater numbers in the general population mean that there are more non-Christians today than there were half a century ago."

AN OFFERING OF GOLD

A story reminiscent of Exodus 35—the gifts of the Israelites for the building of the Tabernacle—comes from Budapest, Hungary.

"Gold rings, bracelets, and family trinkets were sacrificed by Budapest's largest Lutheran congregation to rebuild its war-damaged church," reports *Religious Digest*. "Because of Hungary's sky-high inflation, gold was the only value the contractor would accept. Members of the congregation decided, therefore, to hold collections of gold ornaments on three consecutive Sundays, and in this way raised the equivalent of 500 grams of gold, enough to meet the builder's bill."

THE ACID TEST

Apostolic Faith Bible School History

In all ages it has pleased the Lord to seek after those individuals that would serve Him faithfully. Through different methods and acts God has taught them of His holy will. When God speaks to a man it is the most important event of his life. A school and a schoolmaster are associated with learning. In Gal. 3:24 the law is called a school master, denoting the fact that people knew of this method of instruction. In one case we find that Paul is spoken of as "disput-ing daily in the school of Tyrannus. In the tenth chapter of first Samuel, the reading, a company of prophets, might well imply a Bible school. Many Bible schools have been established in various countries, through which God has given knowledge for that day and generation.

In 1899 Chas. F. Parham established the Bethel Bible School Topeka, Kansas. Through much study and prayer the school advanced, and it pleased God to pour out the Baptism of the Holy Ghost on this waiting, seeking group. Their witnessing brought bout the well established Tongues Movements" of today. about the In 1905 Chas. F. Parham conducted another Bible school in Houston, Texas. From this unit another clan of teachers went forth spreading the glad tidings everywhere. The teachings of our movement for a number of years was promulgated principally through the teachings of its leaders in camp meetings and revivals, so the beautiful Word and powerful Word marched on, adding daily hungry hearts and honest opened-minded believers to the ranks.

In 1936 Robt. L. Parham was impressed deeply of the Lord to conduct another Bible School. In 1937 the Bethel Bible School convened in the Old Parham home with Robt. L. Parham as dean. Another term under the same leadership followed in 1938. These efforts were well rewarded of the Lord and the results were farreaching with many of our present ministers as former students.

In the camp meeting of 1944

it was decided that a school should be established and action was taken accordingly. This resulted in the Apostolic Faith Bible School, conducted in Wichita, Kansas, in the winter of 1945 under the leadership of Ben Barker. The New York Tabernacle was used as a classroom.

Through the purchase of our present school home here in Baxter Springs, Kansas, the school has been placed upon more permanent bases. The terms of 1946 and 1947 have been outstanding in their progress under the direction of Tica L. Taber as dean. Each term something is added that marks for improvement. We of the Apostolic Faith Movement count this as "Our School, and with a far reaching vision and a deep seated burden look to the Lord for His guidance and protection as we advance."

In this short account it will not be possible to name all of the persons that have worked to build this fine school. For they are many, both known and unknown, seen and unseen. However, we pause in honor of those that have gone on, for the Lord in His wisdom has called from our number several loved ones. They are: Rev. Robert L. Parham, dean and teacher of the terms of 37 and 38. Brother T. B. Tucker one of the directors of the present school home. From our student body the deceased are Rev. Claude Parham, Sister Anna Beth Pletcher, Brother Marion E. Corl and Brother Edward H. Tucker. While we miss them greatly, by the help of the Lord we are filling up the ranks and pressing on.

Complete records of the past terms have not been kept, however, in the terms of 1937 and 1938 there was about 60 enrolled each term, and in the last three terms about 80 each time, so that about 360 students have been instructed. Many of these have become very useful in their respective fields.

Victorious Tither

The subject of this sketch is national president of one of the most loved of all Bible distribution agencies. In the year of 1926 he made the discovery that the Federal Government recognizes fifteen per cent as the basis for giving to Christian and charitable organizations, and immediately adopted that plan for his own life. He says:

"When I discovered that the Federal Government permitted the deduction of 15 per cent as non-taxable if paid to church or charity, I was curious to know the manner in which this percentage had been decided upon. Investigation showed that it was the standard basis of stewardship for all faithful Jews: the first fruits or 1 2/3 per cent, plus the tithe or 10 per cent, plus one-third of the 'three-year tithe for the poor' or 3 1/3 per cent, a total of fifteen

per cent. Then I discovered that Malachi 3:10 says: 'Bring ye all the tithes,' and not 'bring ye all the tithe.' Since that meant more than just one tithe, and since the Jew without Jesus Christ gives the fifteen per cent, I was just too ashamed to give less since I have Jesus Christ so precious in my heart.

"Within six weeks after my wife and I began the fifteen per cent tithing, a lady made her will and left my organization some seventy-five thousand dollars as an endowment. I am convinced that, while this money did not come to my wife and I personally, but came to the work we so much love, it was just another case of the outpoured blessings upon two souls who received greater light on stewardship and followed that light humbly and obediently."

Conditional Immortality

Glayron Kieth Rees

In taking up the study of one of the most blessed truths of the Bible, we would first like to express the views and ideas of certain eminent men. We would like to make it clear that these are not our own personal ideas, but the ideas of others concerning the soul.

Samuel Drew says, the soul is a simple immaterial substance. Whatever has parts cannot be immaterial. To suppose any substance to have parts destroys its immateriality, an exclusion of all parts is necessary to the existence of immaterial substance. Whatever has an exterior must have an interior.

Dr. Spicer states, the soul exists wholly independent of the body which it inhabits, although there are certain actions it cannot perform without using the body. It can neither hear, see, nor speak

without using the body.

Lester F. Ward, A.M., of the Smithsonian Institute, Washington, D. C., says, the consciousness when scientifically examined, reveals itself as a quality of the brain. It is a universal deduction of science, that modification of the brain results in modification of consciousness, and that the destruction of the brain results in destruction of consciousness. This has been observed by science.

It has been said that the soul of man is immaterial, uncompounded, indivisible, indestructible, intangible, having no exterior or interior surface. If it has any parts it becomes material; and therefore it cannot be immortal; therefore, it has no voice, no eyes, no ears, no

feet, no nerves, etc.

All the aforementioned thoughts are man's deduction. Now we want to turn to the Book of Books, the Bible, and find out what thus saith the Lord.

Dr. Adam Clark wisely has stated that the doctrine which cannot stand the test of rational investigation cannot be true. Some say that some doctrine is not to be found in the Bible, but is given purely by revelation. There is no such doctrine in the Bible. Paul

says, "Prove all things, hold fast that which is good." Let us follow his counsel. What is not taught in the Bible cannot be considered a Bible doctrine.

The great question of all time is, "If a man die, shall he live again." In Psalms 145:20, we find the promise that the Lord will preserve all them that love Him, but He will destroy all the wicked. Again in Romans 6:23 we find, "the wages of sin is death but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord." Both of these scriptures plainly tell us who will live and who will die or be destroyed.

The first Adam became a living soul, Genesis 2:7. Not immortal soul. The second Adam (Jesus Christ), became a quickening spirit. 1 Cor. 15:45. The first Adam was of the earth earthy. The second Adam was the Lord from heaven. Can you not see the difference in the two? We are all of the first Adam, but we have an opportunity of becoming as the second Adam—a quickening spirit.

The first lie the devil told man was the lie to Adam and Eve that, "ye shall not surely die." Even today the devil still delights in telling humanity that they are immortal and shall not die. The wages of sin is still death.



Immortality is an attribute of God, as so plainly taught in 1 Timothy 1:15-17. A poor sinner is not immortal, but he has the right to believe unto everlasting life.

Concerning man at the time of death in Job 34:15, it reads, "All flesh shall perish together, and man shall turn again unto dust." Psalms 103:14, "For he knoweth our frame; he remembereth that we are dust." If we can just see the frailness of man. We are made of dust and to dust we shall return. Daniel 12:2 tells us that many of them that sleep in the dust of the earth shall awake—some to everlasting life and some to shame and everlasting contempt. Isaiah 26:19 states, "Awake, and sing ye that dwell in the dust." Man's destiny at death is to go back to dust. You may ask is that the end of man? No. At God's appointed time that dust shall take shape and man shall be resurrected.

Some may say, "Yes, but Adam was a living soul." Shall we study the soul awhile. Job 12:10 says that in God's hand is the soul of every living thing. Revelation 16:3 tells us that every living soul died in the sea. This spoke not only of man but fish as well. Every living thing takes in animals as well as man. You may ask what is the difference between man and animal. We wish for you to see what brings immortality to us. It is not our inheritance, but we, man, have a promise of a Saviour to redeem our soul. In Eccl. 3:19, we have the same thought brought out again that man dieth, and beast dieth-they all have one breath. Man is higher than beast through the promise of God of a personal redeemer.

In Ezekiel 18:4 we read that the soul that sinneth, it shall die. Isn't that plain, yet men sing and talk of the "never dying soul." It is Bible doctrine that the soul of the sinner shall die. Job 4:17, asks the question, shall mortal man be more than God. Do you not recognize that fact that we are mortal? But if Christ is our Saviour, on the resurrection morning we shall put on immortality. We cannot be both mortal and immortal.

The spirit returns to God who gave it. Eccl. 12:7. The common teaching of today is that this is the soul, but God's word does not teach it so. Notice in the preceding verse (Eccl. 12:6) that it is speaking of all both wicked and good. If the common teaching is true then both the good and wicked get to enjoy the glory of heaven until the judgment day as both of their spirits go back to God.

Let us consider that which made Adam a living soul. God breathed in his nostrils the Breath of Life and he became a living soul. God takes away the breath of life and man dies.

Job 12:3 tells us that the Spirit of God is in his nostrils. If the spirt and soul are the same this would make the dwelling place of the soul in the nostrils. God forbid! In this case God is speaking of the Breath of Life. Psalms 146:4 confirms this with the fact man's breath goes forth and returns to the earth, and in that day his thoughts perish.

This brings up another question. What is the state of the soul? Is it conscious. Men tell us that our loved ones are in Heaven now looking down and hearing all we say. Also, that they are singing in heaven tonight. This is all the teaching of man. IF the soul of man is immortal as claimed, according to statements by eminent Bible scholars, doctors, scientists and ministers in agreement it can have no parts, how can people be singing in heaven with no voice. How can they see without eyes, feel without nerves, hear without ears? All this teaching sounds like a wierd myth. Heaven will be a real place with real people, not a place of spooks.

Eccl. 9:5 tells us that the dead know NOTHING. Job 14:21 says, a man's sons came to honour and he knew it not; they are brought low, but he perceiveth it not. Psalms 13:3 speaks of death as the sleep of death. Jesus said, in Matt. 9:24, the maid is not dead but sleepeth. In John 11:11, He spoke of Lazarus as being asleep. Thus we find death spoken of as a sleep. At God's appointed time and not until God's appointed

time shall man awake from the sleep of death.

Soul and spirit are used in the Bible 900 times. They are NEV-

ER used as immortal. The question arises, who is immortal? God is immortal. 1 Tim. 1:17. Christ abolished death, and hath brought life and immortality to light through the gospel. 11 Tim. 1:10. Christ reveals it and brings it to us through the gospel. 1 Tim. 6:16 tells us that at the appearing of Jesus Christ He will prove who is the blessed and only Potentate, the King of Kings and Lord of Lords, who only hath immortality. Man can never approach immortality. All of our works and self righteousness is as filthy rags in His sight. Mortal man is not worthy of it. It is not natural attribute. Only through Christ our Redeemer do we have the promise of immortality. In Romans 2:7 we have the promise of immortality. After we have put on Him in whom immortality dwells, we must by patient continuance in well doing seek for glory, and honour, and immortality, eternal life. If we

In 1 Cor. 15:52-54 we have the consumation of the great work of immortality. Oh glorious day when in the moment and twinkling of an eye this old mortal body shall be changed like unto His glorious body — Immortal. On that day and not until then can we say, "O death, where is thy sting? O grave where is thy victory? Praise God for victory over the grave through our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ. Outside of Christ there is no ever lasting life nor immortality.



Obedience

"Go ye into all the world and preach the Gospel to every creature." Mark 16:15.

Our risen Lord gave that commission to His disciples to be their primary task. They were to "Go into all the world and preach the Gospel—the good news of Salvation-to every 'creature.' They accepted their commission and gave themselves to obey it to the fullest extent, counting not their lives dear unto themselves. All down through the ages the Lord has raised up those who have heard Him commissioning them and as a result the Gospel message has been taken into remote regions to savage tribes and fever ridden lands. These missionaries believed the marching orders was for them as much as it was for the disciples.

Go Ye.

The fact that Jesus said, "Go ye" should be sufficient for us to prepare ourselves for that great commission. He gave this command expecting us to be obedient. Someone said that "Foreign missions must cease to be our hobby and become our heart-beat." Christ gave this commission stating that all authority in heaven and earth belonged to Him so he has a right

to expect our obedience. He knew that obedience would cost them, maybe their lives. He foresaw James beheaded, Stephen stoned, Peter crucified, Paul cast into prison and yet He gave this order expecting we would fulfill it. Christ wants us to be obedient. Christ declared that His work was to do the will of His Father and so He expects of us to be obedient too.

Obedience Costs.

The disciples went forth knowing that it would in all probability cost them their lives but they were obedient so should we too "go" even if it means losing our lives. When faced with such things as imprisonment for preaching Christ, they said, "We must obey God, rather than men." It has been this kind of men and women that have taken the Gospel to many lands. We need that obedience in the Christian life today. It seems to be lacking. Men and women have their eyes on the things of the world that glitter for a moment but which are not lasting. With men and women who are ready to abandon themselves entirely to Christ, regardless of the cost, the Gospel can be taken to every tribe and creature on the earth in our life time. But He needs men and women who are obedient, those who do not count the cost but rather that are willing to listen to His command "Go ye." It means obeying Christ instead of pampering pride or appeasing appetites. It may Cost but He is worthy of your obedience at whatever the cost.

The Great Task.

Today after twenty centuries of Gospel privilege there are more than eight hundred millions who still live in darkness and superstition and do not know that Jesus saves. We cannot get away from the fact we are responsible for the heathen in our own generation. His command is as much for us as it was for His disciples and why are so many yet in darkness who have never heard? We must admit we have fallen down on the job. Down where we work there are cities of 40,000 and not one Christian? Whose fault is it? The Christians have fallen down on the job they have not heeded His command. Each one of us have our part to do. We cannot put it on the other fellow. For one it may be the ministry of prayer. God still needs intercessors. He said we were to "pray the Lord of the harvest that He would send forth reapers into His harvest. If He calls us to prayer we should be ready to do His calling. It might be He wants us to give of our means. Like Sofia of Brooklyn who said she was called to scrub and preach. She supported three missionaries by scrubbing offices in New York and so won thousands to Christ. The trouble with many Christians they do not want to give and sacrifice so they will not receive the reward in Glory.

Our Responsibility.

Too often those whom He calls upon are satisfied to make a gift to missions while others whom He calls upon to give sacrificially try to satisfy their hearts with a little prayer for missions. But so many He calls to "Go" try to get out of it with excuses of health or not prepared or something but in so doing they are not obeying His command. Each one has his or her responsibility and cannot escape

from it. May we be obedient to His command. It will pay the greatest dividends.
