Program Description

This two-year program prepares students for the field of cosmetology with study and hands-on experience under the direction of licensed hair-care professionals.

Students must attend an orientation with a parent or guardian. It needs to be understood that the program requires a solid commitment and long hours. Class is held Tuesday through Friday from 12:45 p.m. to 4:30 p.m. and on Saturday from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Students are required to attend class every Saturday.

Students will receive 1,500 hours of instruction over the course of two years. After 350 hours, students are allowed to work on clients. Students will acquire a thorough knowledge of: hairstyling, haircutting and shaping, permanent waving, shampooing, hair coloring, manicuring, and facial/scalp treatments. Upon completion of 1,500 hours of instruction, students are eligible to take the state test to become a licensed cosmetologist.

Students participating in extracurricular activities are advised not to take the Cosmetology program.

Special Features

The successful program completer will have the necessary skills and training to sit for the State of Michigan Cosmetology licensing examination.

Students must provide own transportation (Tuesday through Friday) to the Cosmetology Bus Hub at Flat Rock High School and to Michigan College of Beauty on Saturdays.
