Comments:	Palo Verde – Spanish for green wood/stick – alludes to the tree's

greenish branches & trunk. Deciduous; needs full sun; needs good drainage; drought tolerant. Blue requires more water; grows faster, but dies sooner. Foothills thrive in coarser soil; can live for 100+ years. Desert Museum species developed in 1980's - thornless, blooms throughout the summer. Casts light shade, so many sun loving plants, including cacti, can grow beneath them; seeds are edible; fairly pest resistant, except termites and palo verde rootborers – don't grow these near a wood home.
