



Ohiopyle's New Fire Chief



Jimmy Sproul of Ohiopyle has been a fireman since he was 18 years old. After 25 consecutive years of service, he became a life member at the Farmington Fire Department. Sproul was Fire Chief from 1994 through 2001 at which time he became a Police Officer at the Uniontown Hospital. He likes working the evening shift, "I would say I have seen it all, but something crazier will come through the doors tomorrow," he shook his head.

Ohiopyle's new Fire Chief has been a member at the Ohiopyle station for seven years. He was approached by Dale Leonard, Fire Chief at the time, to join in his home town due to his experience. "My grandfather Corristan was Chief here from 1951 to 1962, the year he died," Sproul recalled. "I told the guys I did not want to be an officer. I would do as much as I could. I help out a lot at the Buckwheat Supper. I held the Second Lieutenant position for three years. I was the only 50 year old 2nd Lieutenant in Fayette County," he laughed.

Sproul then became the safety officer, overseeing incidents. When Mike Smithburger decided to step down Sproul was the obvious choice. He has the experience needed. Much of the membership is aging. "So, here I am," he said. "On a whole the Ohiopyle-Stewart Fire Department is strong. We couldn't do it without the Buckwheat Suppers.

"To put the suppers on, it takes about 30% fire department members and their families, and 70% community volunteers. They really come out to help with those suppers. It's a reunion in the fall. Our whole family rents the guest houses from around here. They come from all over.

"Basic fire essentials class now takes around 160 hours. It used to be 60 hours. It is hard for people to have time to do the classes. You have to be 18 years old to do that, but Junior Firefighters can join at 14 years old. They help out at the fire house. It's best to get

them interested while they are young. They learn responsibility and how things work."

BECOME A FIRE PERSON

"Campaigning for members is difficult. The young people need to know they are welcome here, both female and male. The other mountain departments have women members and there are many women in the ambulance crews. We have safety programs at the schools in October. It helps. Our young members often leave for college.

"I hope to take the next fireman under my wing for a few years, and if he is still around, pass the torch." Jimmy is 63.

"At our meeting Monday there were the three executive officers that it takes to run the meeting, and me. That was it and that is average. I worry where the fire department is going to be in a few years. If our young people don't step up.

"When we grew up as kids this is where the kids were. Not now," Sproul reminisced. "My mother would let us stay in town after school and tell me to get a ride home, at seven years old. I would go sit on the bench at Hostettler's Store and try to bum a ride by dinnertime. Just don't be late for supper!" We laughed.

"Then we would come back in the evenings and visit everybody on the front porches. That was your evening. The porches are still here."

To younger firemen Jimmy Sproul implores to you, "Please join. Get involved. It is a great learning experience and good atmosphere. It keeps younger people out of trouble. I say this to the parents. Let your kids be fire people. It keeps them off the street, they learn skills and the rules.

"We house one of only two or three Air trucks in the county. We take the breathing apparatus to mutual aid calls. During the summer months the 6 x 6 rescue truck stays busy due to the influx of tourists on the river, Meadow Run slides, the bike and hike trails. We get more calls to Meadow Run than anywhere." he laughed.

Two questions I have not been able to answer for researchers are:



Books to Film by Marci Lynn McGuinness

When I am out and about, people always ask, "What are you working on now?"

In addition to this magazine, I am writing and pitching a feature screenplay, a mini series and two television pilots, each inspired by true stories to which I own the rights:

SPEED KING

Twenty four years ago antique collector Jim Boyd of Jockey Hollow, PA contacted me. He asked that I come to his home, so I met him in his treasure trove of a basement. In his arms he held a stack of old newspapers, framed panoramic photographs, programs and the like.

Jim said, "Promise me that you will do something with this."

"What is it?" I asked.

"Promise me. This is important."

We stared at each other until I promised. He smiled broadly and sat his armload on an already cluttered table. The elderly man introduced me to the Uniontown Speedway board track of 1916 - 1922 fame and the Summit Mountain Hill Climbs that preceded the early auto record setting proving ground.

Since then I have published two books on the subject (Yesteryear at the Uniontown Speedway and Speedway Kings), wrote a short video, have given many talks and pitched the story to a couple dozen Hollywood producers. Last year I took the ScreenwritingU Pro Series from Hal and Cheryl Croasnum and rewrote the Speed King story into a feature length screenplay. I recently outlined a mini series based on Speed King and am also pitching to television producers and managers. I belong to several strong film associations and will be pitching steadily until I sell this film. (Below is a 1930 clip from the Evening Standard, Uniontown).



NIGHT AGENT

A few years ago several boxes arrived on my doorstep. They were from Kansas. I was very curious. A boy I knew in Ohiopyle as a child sent them, Ross Rogalski. He had cleaned out his parent's basement in Connellsville and found the original manuscripts, journals, diaries, and letters left behind by author and Western Maryland Railroad Agent, Lillian McCahan.

Since then I published the book, Ohiopyle, That Little Town, WWII, crediting her work. Since publishing the book, I have deciphered some of her shorthand written diaries and learned a few things about the inner workings of her life, her motives when she took it upon herself to call in Pittsburgh conservationists to preserve Ferncliff Peninsula and Ohiopyle. She was a church lady by day and someone else by night. Her revenge against a town that would not heel to her wishes backfires on her in my screenplay, Night Agent, inspired by this story. Her married lover loses his coal mines and property and they close her beloved Ohiopyle Railroad Station, ending her job. As the conservancy plans its grand opening, someone burns the beloved Ohiopyle House Hotel with a family

inside. The scenes for this film are outlined and in July, I hope to have a finished thriller to pitch. I have been advised by several producers to write my true stories for television as the opportunities there have opened up. ..and so I am.




"We appreciate the community's business and the are excited to serve them. We are passionate about employing locals so they do not need to leave the area for work."



Lord Palumbo's Kentuck Knob

Celebrates 20 Years Open to the Public



Lord Peter Palumbo chats with author Marci Lynn McGuinness about Kentuck Knob, the Frank Lloyd Wright home he fell in love with in 1985.

The Hagans had the property on the market for three years. He felt he must do something about it.

"Fate was waiting in the wings," Lord Palumbo

When Lord Palumbo first arrived at Hagan's Kentuck Knob, the Frank Lloyd Wright house above Ohiopyle, there was no one there. "The house was waiting for me," he told McGuinness. "Fate was playing its hand. You should always go along with it in total agreement."

It was 1985. A long time art collector and owner of architecturally outstanding homes, he strongly felt, "The property should be loved, cherished and maintained as far into the future as anyone can see." Six weeks later, he purchased the home and lived there several months each year for a decade.

Wright never visited the site of Kentuck Knob before designing. The 86 year old had Bernadine and I. N Hagan visit him in 1954, interviewed them and said, "I'll shake a design out of my sleep." In 1956, they moved into the one story sandstone home with a breathtaking view.

In 1997, Peter and Hayat Palumbo opened the masterpiece to the public. At first students were requesting visits. Today 33,000 to 35,000 tour the home each year. A repository for Lord Palumbo's pottery, artifacts and artwork, the home is so welcoming that many say, "We love this house. We feel we could bring our pj's and settle right in."

Our region has become dear to the Palumbo family.

"Pennsylvania is a most magical state," he shared.

At 82, he is hoping to spend more than the usual four months per year at their beloved abode.

"It is a great privilege and pleasure to own Kentuck Knob. It is very special, a work that is representative of the Usonian category of house by the United State's best architect."

The family dog, Lilly, spent the afternoon with us, often greeting visitors. Kentuck Knob has a euphoric feel to it, a soft openness.



Buying Houses from those in Need in Fayette County, PA

"Josh wanted to do something that helped other people and he was interested in real estate," Jordan DeGusipe said. "He came to me and said 'Let's start buying houses.' I said 'How? Why?'"

"We can help them move. People who can't afford closing costs and repairs," he told his new wife.

"We bought a duplex. A family friend needed to get out from under her house. We did the repair work ourselves and rented it out. Another woman wanted to sell. We bought her house in as-is condition, moved her. We pay all closing costs so that all the profit goes to the seller. If someone needs to sell quickly, we have closed in three days before. It is just the two of us, but we are the largest team of private home buyers in Fayette County. It keeps people from losing their houses.

Avoid Foreclosure!

"The government banks on the selling process being longer than they can hold out. "Josh works as a lab tech for Golden Eagle. We have a full time person who also works for us working on the houses. We had a producer approach us about doing a television show about the process. We have not heard from them for a while, but signed a nine month agreement. It has been rewarding. Older women who can't sell or get around, people who live elsewhere and inherit homes here, many just can't afford repair costs to get their homes up to standards for inspection.




"We have come up with systems that work for us. So far we have bought 10 homes in a year. We look at a lot more, but the house has to work for us. Some homes can not be fixed.

We are growing right now. We have a lawyer who handles the closing, but we do the rest of the work. We redo them and rent them out. Some of the situations we get in really are made for TV," she laughed.
