

Greetings from your Parish Nurse,

I was talking to my daughter...she is having to make some important decisions for her family and herself. It may involve a new job and a major location change. We chatted about how difficult it is to make these decisions because we try to think about all the effects the decision will have—not only now but affecting the future of her children.

Are you going through the process of making major decisions? Are you or your family considering moving to another location? Are you considering a new treatment for an illness? Are you waiting for news of an upcoming procedure? Are you dealing with anything out of your control? Well, join the crowd! I would venture to say that all of us have had to make some tough decisions, not really knowing what the full impact of that decision would be.

In chatting about it, I reminded my daughter that we can't be in control of the future. We can't make everything "just right" for our children or ourselves. Sometimes we just have to take the next step and remind ourselves that though we are not perfect, we are promised that God will be with us. She had just read how Jesus had healed lots of people right in front of his disciples, had made water into wine, had even raised a young girl from the dead; all with the disciples experiencing the miracle of the moment. And yet, when he asked them to take care of feeding the 5000, they panicked and told him "We have only 5 loaves and 2 fish." Was that true? Yes, in a physical sense. But what they had in front of them was Jesus—who was god's own Son and through Whom, many miracles had already been done. The author my daughter had read made the point that Jesus doesn't ask us to do it all on our own, but to turn to Him and trust Him.

And we reminded each other and encouraged each other with the fact that each season of our lives has ups and downs, steps forward and steps back, joys and sorrows, and health and illness. God is asking us to learn the very same lessons that His disciples learned. He told them "Bring them (the fish and loaves) here" and then He proceeded to lead them through the steps to accomplish what needed to be done.

Breakfast Salad



Ingredients

- 3 tbsp. hummus
- 2 c. baby spinach
- 1/4 avocado, sliced
- 5 grape tomatoes, halved
- Salt, to taste
- Black pepper, to taste
- 1 tbsp. olive oil
- 1 tsp. red wine vinegar
- 1 hard-boiled egg, halved

Greek yogurt, optional

- Hot sauce, optional
- 5 Pita chips
- 1/2 tsp. Everything Bagel Seasoning

Directions

- Spread the hummus across the base of a wide bowl with the back of a spoon. Top with baby spinach, avocado slices, and grape tomatoes. Sprinkle with salt and pepper, then drizzle with olive oil and red wine vinegar.
- 2 Top with the egg, then add a dollop of Greek yogurt, dash of hot sauce (optional), and broken pita chips, and sprinkle with Everything Bagel Seasoning, if you like. Stir it all up, mixing in the hummus from the bottom of the plate, and enjoy immediately.
