#### **First reading**

#### Zephaniah 3:14-18

Shout for joy, daughter of Zion, Israel, shout aloud! Rejoice, exult with all your heart, daughter of Jerusalem! The Lord has repealed your sentence; he has driven your enemies away. The Lord, the king of Israel, is in your midst; you have no more evil to fear.

When that day comes, word will come to Jerusalem: Zion, have no fear, do not let your hands fall limp. The Lord your God is in your midst, a victorious warrior. ### Luke 3:10-18

When all the people asked John, 'What must we do?' he answered, 'If anyone has two tunics he must share with the man who has none, and the one with something to eat must do the same.' There were tax collectors too who came for baptism, and these said to him, 'Master, what must we do?' He said to them, 'Exact no more than your rate.' Some soldiers asked him in their turn, 'What about us? What must we do?' He said to them, 'No intimidation! No extortion! Be content with your pay!'

A feeling of expectancy had grown among the people, who were beginning to think that John might be the Christ, so John declared before them all, 'I baptise you with water, but someone is coming, someone who is more powerful than I am, and I am not fit to undo the strap of his sandals; he will baptise you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing-fan is in his hand to clear his threshingfloor and to gather the wheat into his barn; but the chaff he will burn in a fire that will never go out.' As well as this, there were many other things he said to exhort the people and to announce the Good News to them.





### **Reioice in the Lord always**

The third Sunday of Advent is called "Gaudete Sunday" which means "Rejoice Sunday." This title is taken from today's Mass entrance antiphon, "Gaudete in Domino semper" ("Rejoice in the Lord always"). We are called to rejoice because we experience the presence of Jesus in our midst as a result of receiving Him into our lives through our repentance, renewal of life, and by doing God's will. Today we also light the rose candle of the Advent wreath, and the priest may wear rose vestments to express our communal joy in the coming of Jesus as our Saviour. We rejoice because we celebrate the first coming of the Lord at Christmas, recognize His daily presence in our midst, and wait for His return in glory at the end of time. The Scripture readings of this Sunday put emphasis on the importance of joy. In today's first reading, the prophet Zephaniah encourages Jerusalem and Israel to shout out for the joy of their expected deliverance by the Lord. In today's Responsorial Psalm (Is 12:6), the prophet Isaiah gives the same instruction, "Shout with exultation, O city of Zion, for great in your midst is the Holy One of Israel." St. Paul echoes this message of joy in the second reading, a letter written from imprisonment: "Rejoice in the Lord always. I shall say it again, rejoice..." John the Baptist, in today's Gospel, tells us the secret of Christian joy is our wholehearted commitment to God's Way by the doing of His will. John challenges his listeners to show generosity and a sense of fairness so that others may have reason to rejoice. According to John, happiness comes from doing our duties faithfully, doing good for others, and sharing our blessings with others in need. John's call to repentance is a call to joy and restoration. Repentance means a change in the purpose and direction of our lives. John tells the people to act with justice, charity, and honesty, letting their lives reflect their transformation. For us, that transformation occurs when Christ enters our lives, and it is to be reflected in our living in the ways John suggests. This Sunday's readings challenge us to examine our lives and ask ourselves: Am I a person of joy? How can I make others rejoice? We often think that power, fame and accumulating wealth can give us joy and happiness. In reality they give us only temporary joy and happiness. Sadly, however, many of us would sacrifice anything to get them even at the expense of our health and family. As Christians, we are constantly reminded that our true joy and happiness comes from God alone and that we can obtain it through our closeness with Him. Moreover, we can be a person of joy by making others happy. We can do these by mending ruptures, easing or relieving frictions, sharing family responsibilities, working honestly, and treating employees and employers justly. Our domestic and social lives must be put in order. We must abandon our selfish thirst for consumption and, instead, be filled with the expectation of Jesus' coming. We must bear in mind that each one of us plays John the Baptist's role

as Christ's precursors. Regardless our role as parents or teachers, medical staff, priest, public servants, and so on, we must set a good example of Christian life to others, especially those entrusted to our care. Parents, for instance, are expected to instil in their children a true Christian spirit and an appreciation for Christian values by their own lives and behaviour. Others need to understand their role as God's instruments to lead those under their care to accept Jesus their Lord, Saviour and Brother.

As of 11.59pm Thursday 18 November 2021, the following measures will be applied to Masses at Sacred Heart Parish: Face masks are still required to be worn at all Masses here at


day to make ends meet .




