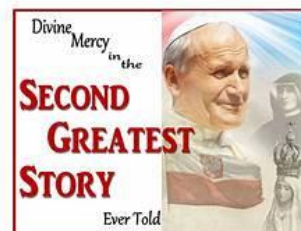

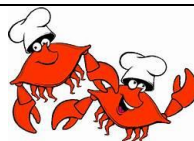

Human Trafficking in our

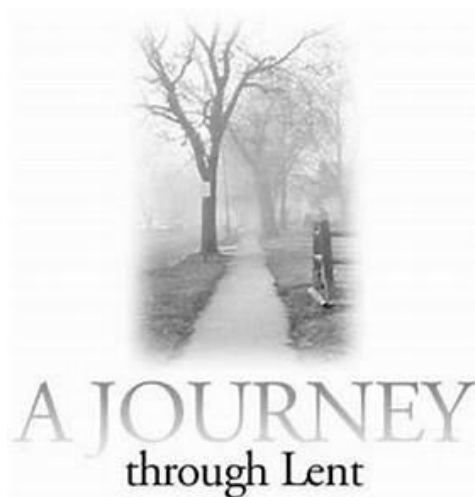
