Did You Know?

There are currently (15) towns in Idaho that collect a city or "local option non property tax".

The rule of thumb to qualify to assess this type of tax?

Be a resort destination city.
Have a population of less than 10,000.

Keeping the health and safety of the public in mind, these cities use LOT tax revenue to mitigate the effects of tourism on their cities that their general funds cannot accommodate.

Projects such as street, crosswalk and sidewalk improvements and maintenance as well as the creation and maintenance of public parks and pathways are examples of how these **non-property tax revenues are repaid directly to the community** in a tangible form as seen in the projects they help to fund.

Please, **BE WATER WISE**

Make the most of the spring melt in your garden.

Where does the snow and ice melt first and where does it last? That gives you an idea of what spots naturally receive more sunlight or less sunlight. Plant these areas first (after frost of course).

Working the earth when it is still too frozen and wet may compact some areas of your garden too much – and plant roots do need loose soil to thrive.

So, first things first: if the ground is still too hard to work, wait for it to thaw more! Do what the old gardeners always did: pick up a handful of the earth. If it can be squeezed into a ball easily and you're able to mold it, it is still far too wet. 

Armed with an understanding of basic xeriscape principles, we can enjoy beautiful gardens without wasting valuable resources. *Plan your Xeriscape garden now.*

Oregon State University Extension reports that across the nation **irrigation of landscapes accounts for one-third of water used**, meaning less water for drinking, agriculture, or wildlife. Recent drought conditions across most of the country present major challenges, which requires us, as gardeners, to **step up our water conservation efforts.**
