Education & Leadership: Our Secret to Success

Northwest Suburban Integration School District hosted their 8th annual Student Leadership Conference on Monday, May 15, 2018 at the Marriott Minneapolis Northwest in Brooklyn Park. This annual conference unites a diverse group of high school students from across the NWSISD collaborative.



This year, Halima Aden was the conference keynote speaker. The Somali-American, born in a Kenyan refugee camp, was the first contestant to compete in the Miss Minnesota USA pageant, her Miss USA state pageant, in a hijab and burkini. After garnering international media attention from the pageant for staying true to herself and practicing her interpretation of her Muslim faith, she was summoned to New York by fashion industry icon, Carine Roitfeld. She landed the cover of CR Fashion Book Issue 10 after her first professional photo shoot.

Students had the opportunity to participate in workshops, competitions, and a college and career fair. Students competed against their classmates as well as students from across district borders in competitions such as AVID jeopardy, educational games, college exploration, conference theme development, creative storybook writing, employability skills as well as a NWSISD "Shark Tank!"

Through these interactive events and competitions, the Student Leadership Conference supports efforts to help close opportunity gaps by providing a culminating experience to practice college and career readiness skills with professionals from all over the Twin Cities and beyond.



Graduation season begins early for Step-Up Mentorship

Spring brings endings and new beginnings. For twenty-five students across the NWSISD collaborative, graduation happened early this year - thus ending their tenure in the Step-Up Mentorship Program.

Summer Summit Enjoys 8th Year at University of St. Thomas

Another school year ended and another crop of nervous, just finished 8th grade boys disembarked their buses onto the University of St. Thomas Minneapolis Campus (UST)



NWSISD along with UST hosted the 8th Annual Summer Summit. Over 80 young men from the NWSISD collaborative spent a week at the Minneapolis Campus of UST June 11-15, 2018. This intense educational experience helps prepare just graduated 8th graders for high school

by focusing on four key educational constructs: Aspirations, Expectations, Opportunities, and Achievement.

Keynote speakers stress the importance of education as a way of maintaining control over one's future. Students participate in classroom activities focused on introspection, learning how culture shapes expectations, setting goals for their high school careers and creating plans that will assist them in



accomplishing those goals.



Student teams consist of students from the varying schools/districts attending. The purpose of placing students together this way was to get them out of their comfort zones, examine commonalities they have with each other, and to capture some leadership qualities that each possess. The teams participated in

competitions throughout the week - including an "Amazing Race" style event and "Fear Factor" competition. Students joined in outdoor sports activities at Loring Park and ended the week with team presentations and trophy presentation to the "winning team."

New partnership to offer paid internships for Park Center Senior High Students Students will have opportunities to prepare for future careers through paid internships with local businesses under a new partnership funded by a grant from the Minnesota Department of Labor and Industry. Osseo Area Schools will share the \$95,000 grant with five other partners, forming one of five pilot programs in the state. Through the Youth Skills Training pilot program, Osseo Area Schools students who are enrolled in designated classes at Park Center can apply for information technology-related internships with local businesses.
