A correction to last month's article- part of the intro dialogue (bold type) was omitted upon translation into the newsletter format. It is central to the understanding of our charge to make disciples of all. Jesus who is the Christ wants You to go forth and proclaim the year of our Lord to all. (missing text) "Christ has defeated our enemy and we are called to stand and proclaim His victory!"

Christ's command remains before us- Heb 10:23-25 Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who promised is faithful. And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near.

And when is the Day?

It is the time when Jesus who is the Christ returns for you and ALL with whom you have shared the Gospel!

VENTURING CREW

Venturing Crew 1785 "survives" winter fun and "Springs" forward

2018 has been an engaging year for St. Paul's Venturing crew so far. The onset of cold weather didn't slow the pace of activities for the crew.

In January, we competed in a Klondike Derby with other Boy Scout troops and Venturing crews in Harpers Ferry, West Virginia and made a strong first showing. There were numerous challenging outdoor stations like fire building, geocaching and a simulated river crossing that made the crew think and put their outdoor skills to the test.

February saw the Venturer's hitting the slopes at Liberty Mountain for a day of skiing, snowboarding and tubing. Despite a couple of rain showers, snow conditions were excellent. Warm cabins with wood-burning stoves at a nearby Scout camp served as our lodging for the weekend. Various card games kept everyone engaged in the evenings.

The crew survived for 24 hours using only their "ten essentials" in natural and tarp shelters they prepared for an overnight in the "wilderness" at Summerseat Farm in March. Water purification was practiced and in addition to collecting fresh pine needles for a nourishing tea, simulated snares yielded some birds (Cornish game hens) just in time for the crew to prepare over an open fire and enjoy dinner al fresco. In addition, we cleared fallen trees and limbs from their nature trail and replaced a rotted trail marker.

In April we headed up to Lums Pond State Park in Delaware for horseback riding. Many of us had never ridden a horse before. The stable owner was thrilled to hear we'd spent some time learning about horses beforehand with Frank & Vicki Rappa, who educated the crew about the various kinds of tack and how to properly mount and dismount a horse. Barry the barrel horse made a special appearance for our training session with the Rappas. Everyone cooled off with a victory ice cream after a warm trail ride through the park. We enjoyed campfire skits with a troop camped nearby. Winter reminded us that is wasn't gone just yet when we awoke to a windy 45F temperature on Sunday morning despite highs in the 80's the day before.

Finally, the youth completed a goal setting and time management seminar while some of the adults completed backcountry outdoor leadership skills training in May. The crew also worked on being good stewards of God's creation by planting milkweed in a plot on the church grounds as part of a wider Boy Scout effort, "Milkweed for Monarchs". The Monarch butterfly has been in decline in recent years, seeing a 1/3 decrease in its "overwintering" count from February 2016 to February 2017. Milkweed is the only host plant for the caterpillars that eventually become the Monarch; they depend upon it as their food source.

In between outings, several local crew activities such as watching movies, playing tennis, swimming and learning about fossils from an area collector provided fun times together.




