Lift Up Your Heads

Men of every walk of life know that we are living in dangerous times. Trouble and distress is written on the faces of all. Humanity would like to hide as it were from the troubles as they exist, but there is no place to hide. We must face the truth. "This know also, that in the last days perilous times shall come. For men shall be lovers of their own selves, covetous, boasters, proud, blasphemers, disobedient to parents, unthankful, unholy, without natural affection, trucebreakers, false ..accusers, ..incontinent, fierce, despisers of those that are good, Traitors, heady, highminded, lovers of pleasure more than lovers of God; Having a form of godliness but denying the power thereof: from such turn away." (2 Tim. 3:1-4). This scripture shows us that in the last days we would have times such as we are seeing today. The term "perilous times" certainly could be interpreted to mean, Dangerous Times. Instead of fretting about the terrible conditions of our times we should rejoice as Christians, because we know we are living in the Last days. The Last Days will bring Redemption to the Elect of God and usher in the Return of Jesus Christ.

Jesus said, "And when these things begin to come to pass, then look up, lift up your heads: for your redemption draweth nigh." (Luke 21:28). To the true believer in Christ, the dangerous (perilous) times in which we live, is the prelude to the most glorious episode to the saints of God recorded in all the story of mankind: RE-DEMPTION DRAWETH NIGH! What did Jesus mean when he said, "And when these things begin to come to pass," —? We find the context to this verse of scripture: "And there shall be signs in the sun, and in the

moon, and in the stars; and upon the earth distress of nations, with perplexity; the sea and the waves roaring; Men's hearts failing them for fear, and for looking after those which are coming on the earth: for the powers of heaven shall be shaken. And then shall they see the Son of man coming in a cloud with power and great glory." (Luke 21:25-27). It is quite plain to the believer in Christ that we are living in the times of the signs of which Jesus spoke. There are signs in the sun, moon and stars; there is indeed distress upon earth. The nations are indeed in distress and in perplexity. Men's hearts are failing them as never before, especially so, as they look after those things that are coming upon the earth. Men are worried about economics, politics at home and abroad; fear of enemy attack from within and without. Men are worried about the advance of science in warfare, fearing even that civilization will eventually wipe itself from the earth. Men are worried about their own imaginations. Only the saints of God have true peace of mind. To them, Redemption Draweth Nigh — Lift Up Your Heads!!!

True, redemption is drawing nigh! Year after year since we have been hearing the preaching of the full-gospel truths, we have seen prophecy after prophecy fulfilled. Each year we see more and more Bible Predictions coming to pass. This would seem to awaken men to the realization that "Jesus is Coming Soon", but not so, men are seemingly asleep. Jesus said," And take heed to yourselves lest at any time your hearts be overcharged with surfeiting, and drunkenness, and cares of this life, and so that day come upon you unawares" (Luke 21:24) Is it possible that

In the parable in Matthew chapter 25, Jesus compares the kingdom of heaven with ten virrins that went out to meet the bridegroom. We are told that five of the virgins were wise and five were foolish. Those that were wise had oil in their vessels, but the foolish had no oil. When the cry went out, "Behold, the bridegroom cometh; go ye out to meet him"; the foolish virgins discovered they had no oil and their lamps had gone out. It was then too late to get oil and prepare their lamps. It was too late!!! Could it be true that some of us as Christians are foolish virgins? Have we permitted time to go by and we have not earnestly sought God in prayer and obedience for the oil of the Spirit: Are we ready for redemption? Lift up your heads for your redemption draweth nigh!!!



Just because we have been a christian all our life or so many years, or a minister, gospel worker, or did some spe-

MODERN NOAH'S ARK TO LIBERIA

A modern "Noah's Ark" intended to bring Christianity and modern farming methods to the Liberian jungle was dedicated near Vicksburg, Mississippi, by Evangelist Billy Graham and left immediately for Africa. Industlialist R. G. Le-Tourneau, who planned the project, said that he believes "hungry natives" will listen to the Christian message of the ark's company "if we can show them a field of grain with a combine harvesting more in a day than they can eat in a year.'

LeTourneau's son-in-law and daughter, Gustav and Louise Dick, are in charge of the expedition. They will supervise the development of 500,000 acres Mr. LeTourneau has leased from the Liberian government for 30 years with option to renew for another 50 years if the venture succeeds. When the ark, a converted Navy LSM (landing craft) with a cruising speed of 10 knots, docks near Baffu Bay on the Guinea Coast Mr. LeTourneau will leave the United States in his twin-engine bomber to join the expedition on African soil.

OIL DRILLING IN ISRAEL

Oil drilling in Israel will start some time this year, it was disclosed in a newspaper dispatch from Paris. Frank Kaftel, president of the New Continental Oil Company, told a Reuters correspondent that there may be "More oil in Israel than in Iraq." The first borings will be in the vicinity of Haifa. The prophecy concerning one of the tribes of Israel, that Asher should "dig his foot in oil" (Deut. 33:24), takes on new meaning.

The Cost of a Boy

Listen to this voice from the dark past: "Now, gentlemen, how much am I offered for this bright, likely boy, only seventeen years old and only half black, comes of good stock, is healthy, has been well raised, got fifty years of work in him and lots of real value, how much am I offered?" Don't be scared, or shudder, at the above utterances, for this is just a dark page of our past history. The slave auction has disappeared. The auction block, thank God, is but a memory. Yet, over the space of barely six decades you may catch once more the echo of these words from the Southern market place — "SOLD!"

I do not ask you to consider the moral side of such a sale, for all that they considered in those days was the commercial features. What did a man buy? — human potentiality, productive power in human form, upon the lowest plane of consideration. WHAT IS YOUR BOY WORTH TODAY — precisely what the slave boy was worth — A CASH INVESTMENT IN MANHOOD?

No, we don't grow boys in any

cheap fashion. Any child in the average home is costly extravagance compared with the old-time slave boy. And yet, after rearing some of them, there is a great possibility that they will not sell as high as the slave boy was sold, if this were permitted.

Can we praise the cold business calculating and wisdom of the slave-holder and his course and not criticize and condemn the poor business policy and folly of the modern father who rears a boy with a far greater the cost than the slave cost and then deliberately sustains a policy for his life that will eventually ruin and completely wipe out his investment?

REMEMBER, fathers, alcohol is one of the strongest forces that is bidding day and night for that boy of yours. Whether his life will be fruitful and a blessing to society will depend a great deal on the manner in which you lead, train and educate that child.

YOU are the pattern that he follows. Every man's life is a ledger with debit and credit accounts. No one can live who fails to pay dividends. It would be a saving to the nation if there was a way whereby we could get rid of all those who had desecrated their lives with liquor and thus have marred and blighted the lives of those that are under their protection. Of course, this cannot be done. The alcoholic is a tremendous financial burden to society. Most of them have never returned to society. Most of them never returned in dividends one dollar of their first cost. It is a solemn thing to assist in sending a man through, and out of life, in debt forever to his fellowmen. It is a far more solemn thing to assist in sending him thus throughout life

forever helplessly a debtor to

his God.

Iran, The Hot Spot

Politically speaking, world attention is divided today between two hot spots," Korea and Iran. Prophetically speaking, the hotest of the two is Iran. For a long time, we have taken the position that the undeclared war in Korea is only a side issue, a test of strength, a mere diversion from the real purposes of the Russian Bear. Though this is a real war in every sense and though casualties have been heavy, it is generally admitted that victory would be no great gain for either side. In Iran, however, much is at stake. With a large proportion of the world's oil being refined here, Russia, Iran, Britain, and America all have a vital interest in the area. Trouble is brewing, for these interests overlap and are at variance with one another. Iranian patriots are against all foreigners. Communists are active, staging riots and demonstrations. Russian armies are on the Iranian borders. British paratroopers and ships are ready for duty. American diplomat is in conference with the Shah. In the ancient land of Persia may be planted and cultivated the seeds of World War III and the Battle of Armageddon. Because of its proximity to the new nation of Israel and its position in the Near East, we view with prophetic interest the important activities now taking place in Iran. The first pages of human history were written in the Middle East, and there the nations will conclude their history.

The Bible foretold our day and beyond. It told of the time when "the end" will be written on the history book of man's rule. The end will come when all nations of each gather themselves in the Near East around the city of Jerusalem, to battle one another for the spoil to be found there. The nations in-

volved will be divided into two groups, one being the great power of the north, Russia and her allies, and the other group composed of nations seeking to stop the northern confederacy from gaining control. Among the nations of the northern confederacy, Russia, Prussia, Turkey, the Balkans, listed in Ezekiel 38, are also listed "Pessia, Ethiopia and Lybia them; all of them with shield and helmet" (v. 5). On the basis of this verse, it is our belief that eventually the British and ourselves will lose our hold in Iran and Iran (Persia) will join the camp of Russia, becoming another swallowed satellite of the greedy Communist Russia. We can forsee also the fall of Turkey, Ethiopia, and Libya (or Egypt as some believe) and eventually even part of Israel into Russian hands.

The oil of Iran is calling the world's attention near to the Middle East, where the last war of history is to be fought. The world is dividing itself; the battle lines are forming; and some day those in Opposition to the northern hosts will say, "You have gone far enough (possibly after the Middle East and North Africa are gobbled up); go one step farther and we fight." A move on Palestine will then draw all nations into battle. There may be a season or two of deceptive peace; there may be minor wars in the meantime; but in the end, we will find Russia and her allies, including most of the Near, Middle, and Far East, and North Africa, drawn up to battle the rest of the world. The moves in Indonesia, Tibet, India, Iran and China are the beginning of the

So, what should we do? World history is in its last chapter. Civilization is grounded now and may soon break upon the rocks of atomic war. Should we not eat, drink and be merry?

Should we join the Communist party so we will be on the side of the coming majority? Should we hope against hope that the Bible has made a mistake and hide our heads in the sands of belief that it may work out all right. None of these is the way out! The Word of God tells what is coming, and it also tells the way of escape. It is much better than science, which can create an atomic bomb, but cannot guarantee escape from destructiveness.

There are awful days coming soon on our world. The rumblings in Iran are only the first notes of the warning trumpet. The wise, who have ears to hear are wondering about a way out. Where is the door to safety? "How shall we escape? Must we, knowing these terrors are stored up for this world, endure these things that are to come to pass? No, praise God, there is a way of escape, through the salvation offered through Jesus Christ.
