Myself by:

- Attending school regularly and being on time.

Property by:

- Taking care of things in my school and on school grounds.
- Leaving dangerous or distracting things at home, such as, matches, lighters,
- weapons, toys, fireworks, alcohol? tobacco/other drugs, medicine not prescribedfor me, etc.
- Using school materials or a classmate's materials for their intended purpose.
- Following rules about safety:
- Using computers as directed by adults.
- Never touching a fi re alarm unless there is an emergency.
- Never making threats about bombs or blowing something up.
- Using playground equipment in a safe manner.
