

The Council established a Health and Safety Task Force and the team began meeting July 15th. The task for this team was to study and inform the council on developments and then recommend an eventual plan for resuming in-person worship. This team began to meet and discuss both the immediate and long-term recommendations for the safety and health of the church and the persons who come to the church campus. As you know, there is one entrance into the buildings at the church office door. You also know that to enter the building, everyone must sign in, and everyone must wear a mask while inside the buildings. The only exception to this mask-wearing-rule is the small number of people who are leading worship on Sunday mornings.


The original process for re-opening, focused on a two week decline in the number of new cases. According to scdhec.gov on June 1, the number of confirmed cases was 263. On July 1, the number was 2,243. On September 20, the number was 393. A link
