
Dessert: Birthday cake to celebrate the many birthdays our members have around the Specialty.

2024 SSCA NATIONAL SPECIALTY

The SSCA National Specialty will be at Purina Farms, just west of St Loius, MO, August 20-25. It is not another Palooza – but the Giant Schnauzer Club will be sharing the show site with us. Many of the activities will be shared by the 2 breeds – and then opened up for all-breed entries to fill the trials. Ed Watson (from California) is the show chair – he has been doing a lot of hard work to make a successful specialty! His assistant show chair is Suzanne Garcia. There will be something for everyone!! All events will be at Purina. The schedule is still somewhat tentative.

Conformation will include the SSCA National on Saturday (Sweepstakes will be Thursday) with Heartland SSC Specialty on Friday and Potomac Valley SSC Specialty on Sunday. All 3 specialties will include Sweepstakes and Junior showmanship.

Performance/companion options are extensive. Obedience, Rally and Agility will be offered on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday. Barn Hunt will be held Friday, Saturday and Sunday. All of these will be hosted by SSCA. FastCAT will run all 5 days. Scent work will be Wednesday and Thursday; CGC/Trick Dog on Saturday and Fetch on Sunday – all hosted by GSCA.

Move-in/set-up will be on Tuesday. People will be permitted on the grounds (RV parking, etc) at 2 p.m. but no access into the building until 4 p.m. The committee needs enough time to get the grooming areas covered, marked and ready for exhibitors to set up. A Meet/Greet will be held on Wednesday evening with cash bar and complimentary pizza, However, reservations will be required so they can plan correct amount of food. Educational Seminar and Judges' Ed seminars will be on Thursday afternoon. Friday will be our annual meeting preceded by an informal dinner. Saturday night will be the annual awards dinner followed by the Auction and Raffle.

We will also need help the night of the dinner/auction – set up, help with the bidding records, deliver items, paperwork, etc. It takes a lot of man/woman power to make it successful!


Update on AKC Grant to McLean County Sheriff's Department *From Don Kachur*

As reported in a previous newsletter of PSSC, the McLean County Sheriff's Department was awarded \$10,000 toward the purchase of a K-9 cop. This purchase involved a grant award from the American Kennel Club (AKC) in the amount of \$7,500 with a matching of \$2,500 (\$1,000.00 from the Prairieland Standard Schnauzer Club of Central Illinois and \$1,500 from the Corn Belt Kennel Club).

The latest news from the McLean County Sheriff's Department is that they have the police car for the new dog and are in the process of ordering related equipment to complete the outfitting of that car. They plan to purchase a K-9 Cop and select their third handler this spring. Presently the Sheriff's Department has two dogs recently reassigned and back in service with their agency.

The PSSC and Corn Belt Kennel Club are working on plans to promote this spring fundraising for the Adopt a K9 Cop project. Possible sites for promotion include the Bloomington Farmers Market and the special adoption and vaccination events at PetSmart and Petco. Presently there is a gofundme *Adopt a K-9 Cop* account.

The two local dog clubs are planning on purchasing tennis balls with a dog logo that can be provided as a memento to those who make donations to this project. For further information on this project, feel free to contact Don Kachur at 309-824-4561 or at dskachu@ilstu.edu.

February 2024 Update to Clubs

Regional National Owner-Handled Series (NOHS) Only Event Pilot Program

A pilot program has been approved to allow up to eight NOHS Regional events to be held by all-breed clubs. The events will be structured like the NOHS Finals in Orlando, except they will not be an invitational. All owner-handlers eligible for the NOHS program may participate. A communication was sent to all-breed clubs that provides more details of the pilot program. Proposals to host a NOHS Regional must be submitted by March 31, 2024. The pilot program will run from September 19, 2024, through September 17, 2025. Any questions about the program or application process can be directed to clubdevelopment@akc.org.

Exhibition Only in the 4-6 Month Beginner Puppy (BPUP) Competition

The regulations for the 4-6 Month Beginner Puppy (BPUP) competition have been modified to allow professional handlers to exhibit dogs they own for exhibition only. Dogs must be marked as exhibition only on their entry form and are subject to the entry fees and eligibility requirements of the class. The exhibition only status of an entry may not be changed after the closing of entries. Exhibition only entries will be judged (examined and gaited) as all other entries but will not be considered for awards. Exhibition only entries will not be included in the calculation of Certificate of Merit (CM) and Puppy of Achievement (POA) points. Exhibition only entries in BPUP is available for events occurring on or after July 31, 2024.

Modifications to Exhibition Restrictions on Sweepstakes and Futurities Judges

The exhibition restrictions on sweepstakes and futurity judges were modified to provide more options for exhibiting. The exhibition restrictions were narrowed to only impact the breeds they are judging. The new policy, effective for

judging held on or after March 6, 2024, is: Sweepstake/Futurity judges may not exhibit the same breed in conformation at events held on the day(s) they judge within 200 miles of their assignment. Sweepstake/Futurity judges may exhibit in the same breed the day before and the day after the event they judge. A multi-day show is considered one event, and the restriction will apply for the duration of the event.

Uploading Premium Lists and Judging Programs

Clubs can use the Public Documents tool within the Online Event

Management system to upload and attach their premium lists, judging
programs, and other public documents to their events within the AKC system.

Once the club has uploaded a document and attached it to an event, a link to
the document will be available as part of the event information within the AKC

Event Search & Results. We encourage clubs to upload their documents to
provide exhibitors access to information about their events. If a club needs
assistance accessing the Online Event Management system or uploading their
documents, they should contact eventplans@akc.org. Superintendents are
responsible for uploading the documents for the events they fully manage.

Will County Emergency Management

May 8th is National Animal Disaster Preparedness Day, and we'd like to encourage you to participate in the observation of this day. This is a great opportunity to showcase the importance of being prepared for the unexpected. At this time of year, natural disasters increase, and families are either forced to leave their homes immediately or shelter in place. Emergencies can happen at any time, so it is crucial that people have a plan for themselves as well as their beloved pets.

Important reminders for pet owners include having their pet's information on hand as well as a portable emergency supply kit. We encourage pet owners to have our Pet Emergency Guide in their supply kit, www.akcreunite.org/wp-content/uploads/2013/08/AKC-Reunite-Pet-Emergency-Guide.pdf.

It is also imperative that not only are pets microchipped but also enrolled in a national 24/7 recovery service like <u>AKC Reunite</u>. If a pet is already microchipped and enrolled it's worth double checking that the information listed with that pet is up to date. Enrolled microchips increase the chance of finding pets post-disaster and having them returned home safely.

As you own an AKC Pet Disaster Relief Trailer, we encourage you to help bring awareness on this day whether that be with social media or news posts, training events, microchipping clinics, check the chip clinics, or email blasts. It's a great opportunity to remind the community how well you, their emergency management first responders, are prepared.

Hopefully, none of us will experience a disaster that will require extreme measures but it always better to be safe than sorry. Taking the small steps now to ensure pet safety and security in a moment of crisis can make a world of difference.

Please let us know if you plan to participate in any way on this day. If there is anything you'd need from AKC Reunite to help kick off an event for this day, please let me know that as well. I'd love to help!



PACK A PORTABLE EMERGENCY SUPPLY KIT

A waterproof backpack or suitcase on wheels works great!



Collar with your pet's current identification and rabies tags, as well as a secure leash/harness



Bowls, lots of water and food for at least three days, as well as items for clean up like plastic bags or a litter and litter pan



Blanket, flashlight and batteries, liquid soap and baby wipes



Collapsible crate or pet carrier, blanket or sheet to cover the crate for pet's solitude and your pet's favorite toy for comfort



Human and animal first aid kits. Don't forget to pack prescribed medications for you and your pet, too! Flea and tick treatment is also important for a hurricane aftermath and any other significant rain/flooding water event



Fully-charged cell phone. Scan this QR code to add AKC Reunite to your contacts so you never miss our call



BEFORE AND WHEN EVACUATING, KNOW WHAT TO DO AND WHERE TO GO

IMPORTANT! The safest place for your pet is to be with YOU!

If conditions are not safe for you, then it's not a safe place for your pet either! Always follow all evacuation orders and NEVER leave your pet behind at home.

Go to **www.redcross.org/get-help** to find a list of open emergency shelters in your area. Call ahead for guidance on safe pet sheltering options for both you and your pet.

DON'T FORGET IMPORTANT PAPERWORK TO HELP PROVE OWNERSHIP TO ENSURE YOUR PET'S CARE!

TIP! Create a folder on your mobile phone with photos of these records so they are always accessible.

- Current photograph of you and your pet together to show to authorities in case you and your pet are separated.
- Medical records that indicate dates of vaccinations and your pet's microchip ID number.
- · List of any medications your pet takes and why.
- Proof ownership, including copies adoption/ purchase paperwork, registration information, microchip enrollment confirmation.



AT THE FIRST MENTION OF A PENDING DISASTER

- Bring your pets inside so you won't have to search for them if you need to quickly evacuate.
- Make sure your pet's collar is securely fastened with legible collar ID tags.
- Have your Portable Supply Kit ready to GRAB-AND-GO with supplies needed for you and your pet. Consider making duplicate bags — just in case!
- Call emergency shelters ahead of time to confirm petfriendly accommodations.
- Confirm your contact information is up to date with AKC Reunite.







CPR includes **chest compressions** to get blood flowing, and rescue breaths to deliver oxygen to the organs.

If you find your pet unresponsive, attempt to stimulate him by shaking or calling his name. If he doesn't respond, check for breathing. If your pet is breathing, get him to the closest veterinary office.

If your pet isn't breathing, check to make sure her windpipe is clear. Pull the mouth open, grasp the tongue, pull the tongue toward you and get a look all the way to the back of the throat. If you see something in there, gently try to remove it. Be careful not to push it further into the airway. If this invokes a response from your pet, stop! Beware of bites.

If a response is not elicited, call for help. CPR is a team sport and remember, your primary goal is to get your pet to the closest open veterinary hospital. So ask your helper to go and get the car immediately while you start CPR.

Start by doing 30 chest compressions, pause to deliver 2 quick breaths, then immediately **repeat** both steps.

Chest Compressions:

Find Your Compression Location



Dogs with round chests

(such as Labrador Retrievers)

Lay the dog on his side and focus the chest compressions over the widest part of the chest.



Dogs with narrow, deep-chests

(such as Greyhounds)

Lay her on her side, but push directly over the heart to try to squeeze it.



Small dogs and cats

(generally all have a narrow chest)

Focus your compressions directly over the heart. To minimize the chance of squeezing too hard, you could do compressions with one hand, rather than the two-handed approach.



Dogs with squishy-faces sometimes have flat chests (like English Bulldogs)

Try laying them on their backs. Put your hands directly over the breastbone and push on the solid piece of bone. If the dog doesn't easily stay on his back, lay him on his side and do compressions as you would for a round


Get in Position

1. Kneel or stand behind your pet.

2. Put one hand on top of the other with the fingers interlaced. Focus the force of your compression on the heel of the hand that's touching the chest.

3. Place your shoulders directly above your hands and keep your elbows locked.

Bend at the waist, not at the elbows.



For medium to large breed dogs, you'll have to push hard to compress the chest by 1/3! In small dogs and cats, it's easy to push too hard, so be sure not to compress more than 1/2 the width of the chest!

5. Aim for about 100 - 120 compressions per minute,

or about two compressions every second. Sing a song in your head to keep the right beat such as "Stavin' Alive"
