Tuesday, March 19 – Hidden Figures – Women of the Delta. Walnut Grove Library, 14177 Market Street, Walnut Grove. Doors open at 5:30. Program from 6:00 to 7:30.

We'll talk about the deep roots of women in the Delta, whose stories are either seldom told or impact on the Delta glossed over. From the Ylamne women who created watertight cooking baskets and cradle baskets for swaddling and carrying babies, to pioneering women like Eliza Greason, a passenger aboard the first steamboat to travel on the Sacramento River, Alice Murakami, an early founder of the River Road Gallery, and Maria Gonsalves, who cooked for over 30 years for those who toiled in the fields and ran a "pop-up" taco stand, in the early 70's. The program will also feature Delta Mello, executive director of the Sacramento History Museum who will portray, Charmain London, the wife of author Jack London. Her role in navigating delta waterways and contribution to Delta literature (not to mention significant editing of her husband's work, has long been ignored. We invite you to share stories of the women in your life who deserve recognition, too.
