



Nemata Blyden, Ph.D., is Associate Professor of History and International Affairs at George Washington University and currently serves as Director of Women's Gender and Sexuality Studies Program. Professor Blyden specializes in African and African Diaspora history and has researched women's issues in nineteenth century Liberia. She has also done work for *Encyclopedia Britannica* and contributed to an on-line historical project called [In Motion: The African-American Migration Experience](#), sponsored by the Schomburg Center for Research in Black Culture of the New York Public Library. Professor Blyden has lived in Africa, Europe, and North America and she remains engaged with issues pertaining to African development. She is currently completing a book entitled, *African Americans and Africa*, to be published with Yale University Press. Dr. Blyden is an alumna of the Annie
