Water Shortage Response Plan

Due to the high heat and lack of rainfall, Washington State is currently experiencing drought conditions. Public Works has been evaluating the impacts this has on the town's water system and has decided to place us in "Stage 1" of the Water Shortage Response Plan. This a "warning level" asking you to acknowledge your water usage and conserve when able. Public Works will continue to monitor the situation and move forward if needed. In the meantime, please be aware of how much water you are using this summer.

- * Water only in the early morning or evening when its cooler, between 8am-8pm.
 - * Adjust sprinklers so they don't spray sidewalks and driveways.
- Wash your car, bathe your pet or let the kids run through the sprinkler in an area of your lawn that needs watering.
 - Check for water leaks and fix them.
 - Adjust your lawn mower to a higher setting. Longer grass shades root systems and holds soil moisture better.
