### **For Immediate Release:**

On September 9 at 10:36pm, Officer Robert Schlossberg was monitoring traffic on Goffle Road when he observed a vehicle pass his location with a violation. Officer Schlossberg stopped the vehicle and as he approached, he detected the odor of marijuana emanating from the vehicle. The subsequent investigation, led to the arrest of Meidan Kleitman, Staten Island, NY, age 35. Mr Kleitman was charged with possession of marijuana and maintenance of lamps. He was released on his own recognizance and is scheduled to appear in municipal court. Sergeant Daniel Kellogg, Officer William Plisich and Officer Michael Scalise assisted.

On September 12 at 9:40pm, Sergeant Michael DeMaio was patrolling the rear of the Boulder Run Shopping Center when he detected the odor of burnt marijuana in the area of the dumpsters. Upon investigation, he observed a male standing behind them acting suspiciously. Further investigation led to the arrest of John Kim, Pompton Lakes, age 23. He was charged with possession of marijuana. He was released on his own recognizance and is scheduled to appear in municipal court. Officer Kenneth Marcoux assisted.

On September 14 at 9:41pm, Officer Michael Flim was dispatched to a resident's home to investigate a violation of a restraining order. Upon his arrival, he observed the female inside the home confirming the violation of the court order. The Judge was contacted and the female was subsequently arrested and charged with defiant trespass and contempt of a court order. The female was transported to Bergen County Jail in default of the \$2,500.00 bail. Sergeant Michael DeMaio and Officer Michael Teegan assisted.
