

Cakes Served at the May Meeting



Several requests were made about the cakes that were served at the May meeting. Rehrucken pans or molds are used to make traditional cakes in Germany. Rehrucken translates to saddle of venison or deer back. It is a half loaf ribbed pan that makes a long ribbed cake. They are usually drizzled with chocolate glaze and studded with standing slivered almonds. This pan is sometimes called a saddle loaf pan. Vicki got hers through Amazon.com. He is also a University Professor. His used slides to show traditional quilts such as Mariners compass, Log cabin and crazy quilts and how they were made in certain time periods. 
The committee is looking forward to each submission to see how the Grand Entrance is interpreted in a quilt.
