
### MATTHEW FONTAINE MAURY - - -THE "PATHFINDER OF THE SEAS"

Matthew Fontaine Maury, of both the United States Navy and the Confederate Navy, was an oceanographer of such renown that he earned the nickname, the "Pathfinder of the Seas".

In 1825 Maury obtained, through the then-U.S. Congressman Sam Houston, a midshipman's warrant in the U.S. Navy. As a midshipman on-board the USS BRANDYWINE, he recorded methods of navigation. When a leg injury left him unfit for sea duty, Maury devoted his time to the study of navigation, meteorology, winds, and currents. He became Superintendent of the U.S. Naval Observatory, head of the Depot of Charts and Instruments and studied thousands of ships' logs and charts. He published the first modern oceanographic textbook with charts showing sailors how to use the ocean's currents and winds to their advantage.

As a Virginian from Spotsylvania County, Maury resigned his U.S. Navy commission and joined the Confederacy. Following the war, Maury taught at VMI and in 1873 was buried at Hollywood cemetery in Richmond.

## REVERSING ROLES - - - MILITARY SEALIFT AND NAVY

The logistics force of Navy Task Force 63 and civilian-crewed Military Sealift Command ships are combined to command all of the U.S. 6th Fleet air and sea logistics. Normally, MSC ships do the supplying at sea by horizontal replenishment (cables or hoses) or vertical replenishment (helicopters).

Recently, COVID-19 issues created

missed, delayed or cancelled supply of a MSC ship itself. The Navy came to the rescue. Because destroyers do not have much storage space, it took three of them teamed up at sea to replenish the MSC ship USNS SUPPLY (T-AOE-6) with fruits, vegetables, gear and mail. According to Navy CTF-63 Logistics Director CDR Bautista, "In my 30 years in the Navy I have never seen a DDG deliver fresh milk to a logistics ship".(Adapted from July issue MSC Newsletter 'Sealift'. ### **NAVY FIXES AVIATION PROBLEM**

The Navy now understands what has been causing symptoms in aviators ranging from headaches to tingly fingers to dizziness to loss of consciousness.

Breathing concentrated oxygen in a small cockpit with restrictive flight gear and masks is hard. Something as simple as a poorly-fitting mask can lead to an increased work of breathing in the dynamic environment of a jet cockpit. Multiple steps were taken in T-45 Trainers and F-18 Hornets to remedy these problems. One of the simpler fixes was to straighten out angled pipes to provide better airflow. Ironically, aviation history is repeating mountaineering history. The 1952 Swiss Everest climbing expedition failed to reach the summit because their system produced oxygen, but had the same problem; the delivery tube and mask restricted airflow and increased the workload of breathing.


