

A Message from our Council President

In May, two opportunities were provided for Trinity members to interpret, understand, and discuss learnings gleaned from the Trinity Congregational Survey conducted in the Fall of 2016. What's taken so long? Honestly, there have been higher priorities: Trinity finances, our 2017 budget, hosting budget forums, our Annual Meeting, setting Council goals for 2017 (which are: evangelism/communication and short and long-range planning), Lent, Easter, our 1st quarter report to the congregation after Easter,

and now—finally--sharing the results of our 2016 Survey.

A good return (33% of surveys distributed) from people at Trinity for 5 years or less, 6-10, 11-15, 16-20, and over 20 years, and several from non-members and former members, was "properly randomized", which means the survey would give us valid and helpful information. The survey also allowed people to comment on all the questions for which we sought answers; and finally allowed all to share anything else they felt they wanted to share. With amazing hely from Jane Gemein, a statistician with over 25 years of experience interpreting and presenting results of this type of survey, we learned that:

- Survey-takers worship regularly--that's very good!
- When they are not at worship, it is due to travel or illness.
- People are happy with our Sunday worship times, (but wonder if we should have Saturday worship--not for them, but for others.)
- People appreciate Trinity's worship style, (but wonder about more contemporary, modern music--primarily for others)
- Members feel they cannot get more involved in Trinity's ministries than they presently are (many are already heavily involved)
- Members believe Trinity leadership either is doing a good job of leading--or is "getting there"
- Many offered suggestions additional fellowship opportunities.
- Confidence is high that Trinity is fulfilling its God-given mission.

These learnings--in time--will be further reviewed by Trinity's Ministry and Action Teams for "tweaking" of much we do and how we do it. Individual survey comments (positive & negative) have been and will be taken seriously--to help us (as Council and congregation) eliminate errors and mistakes made in the past and be faithful in following our Lord and our God today. Survey results, we trust, will (continue to) help us to move forward in a way that is pleasing to God and at the same time, well-serves our entire congregation-present and future! Questions? Just ask!

The land immediately to the west of Trinity is up for sale. A potential buyer (who would build homes on the property) had his realtor meet with Trinity's Executive Committee on May 10. On May 16, the Council received the following information and asked that the congregation be informed about the

- Possible need for an emergency (fire) exit from the that property over Trinity land
- Possibility of bringing "city water" to the property and to Trinity
- Possibility of the sale to the developer of Trinity property that was our "outdoor worship" site .


