FOOD PANTRY NEWS...



Greetings from your Food Pantry. Lots has been going on across the street and we want to share some of the exciting news! The nuts and bolts of the month of February are:

Individuals served: 374

Expenses: \$448

(1st Step Food Bank and His Compassion Ministry)

Food Given Out (dollar amount): \$10,414

(This amount includes food donations from BUMC members, outside individuals and His Compassion Ministry)

We found His Compassion Ministry about 2 years ago through Belleview Area Social Services and what a blessing that has been. His Compassion provides the Food Pantry with a trailer full of food twice a month for our distribution days. This food is free of charge. Because of the bounty they give our Food Pantry we do not have to buy as much from 1st Step Food Bank. In turn, the Food Pantry sows \$100 a month back into His Compassion Ministry. His Compassion has asked BUMC Food Pantry to partner with them and 2 other churches in a grant from the United Way. Belleview UMC will be the southern satellite in Marion County if someone is in a food crisis or missed a food distribution date. When that is determined, our Food Pantry will be contacted and arrangements will be made to provide food assistance. His Compassion will make sure we always have food available. Our Food Pantry will receive \$5,000 for this partnership!







Oh, can't forget about Don and Cheryl with Best Buddies Pet Pantry!! Don and Cheryl found Belleview UMC through our very own Karyn Veternik. They have partnered with our Food Pantry and will come and distribute dog and cat food on the 4th Wednesday of each month to any of our recipients that have the need for this.

BUMC Food Pantry is pleased to introduce Best Buddies Pet Pantry....

Best Buddies Pet Pantry is an all-volunteer 501c3 non-profit and full-time mobile pet food bank that provides free pet food to families & pets in need.

Best Buddies Pet Pantry was founded in 2010 to assist families experiencing financial hardship in our hometown of Chesterton IN. In 2012 the pantry expanded to help other areas of NW Indiana, Lake and LaPorte Counties and southeast suburbs of Chicago IL. As of June 2021 the pantry relocated to central Florida.

During difficult financial times, families struggle to make ends meet and rely on food banks to supplement their food source. Family pets also suffer and do not get proper care and nutrition. Many family pets are surrendered to animal shelters due to pet parents not being able to afford their care. This causes overcrowding and increases the number of pets euthanized. Our mission is to help reduce the number of dogs & cats surrendered to local shelters due to lack of food and keep families and their pets together.







WOW...what a lot to take in!! This is your food pantry so stop by any 2nd and 4th Wednesday from 9am—11:30am to see how your tithes and offerings keep this outreach ministry going. Next month we will share continuing growth in the Food Pantry Garden!!
