During the Board Meeting the new Bylaws were approved. Both the New Constitution and the Bylaws have been issued to the Lions of Georgia by the MD18 State Secretary, Lion Linda Selby.

For the last half of this Lions Year the Board will be putting their efforts on getting more campers to the Camp and to obtaining the funds to meet the budget for 2022.

The Fundraising Committee is very active in implementing several projects for the Camp. (See Bill Owens report below). Now we need for all the Lions Clubs in Georgia to step up and support the Camp with their contributions. The Camp depends upon you the Lions of Georgia. I have asked the Board Members to contact each Club in their district. Eighty percent of the Camp's budget comes from the Lions of Georgia.

I would like to thank the 40+ Lions and a few non Lions that donated to the 2021 Chairman's Challenge. The total collected was \$12,546.

In addition I would like to thank the New Houston County Lions Club for sponsoring the Camp by selling tickets to the Macon Mayhem Hockey team on February 26. (see flyer below).

Another thank you to the Cobb County Lions Club for sponsoring a Casino Night on March 26 (see

attachment) to raise funds for the Camp.

The first is a Caribbean Cruise raffle for 2 people. This is one of our larger fundraisers for the year and the tickets are only \$10 each. The drawing will be on May 14 at the Governors Banquet during the State Convention. The winner will have a full year to use the tickets so it should be easy to work around any schedule or COVID restrictions. Raffle tickets are coming to your local clubs but if you don't hear or see any please let myself or the camp know, and we can make sure you and your club get some tickets. Lions, if we sell all of our tickets for this fundraiser the bulk of our financial obligations for the camp will be met for the year. Buy some tickets, sell some tickets!

We're planning a golf tournament. That was a broad statement as we are still "planning" but we're hoping that it will be a huge event. Currently we are in talks with the Lions Lighthouse about hosting a joint golf tournament. We are very much in the planning (talking) stage of this but I wanted to ask for a little help from you at this stage as well. As we move forward the tournament will need sponsorships and I wanted to ask to see if you know any companies that may be a sponsor for our event? Hole sponsors (typically \$100) are good, but we will need larger corporate sponsorships to really make this event work for both the Camp and Lighthouse. If you think you may have some good connections, please let me or the Camp know.

The last thing I'll mention is the Silent Auction at the State Convention in May. We're only two months away from the Convention and we need items for the Auction. I've done plenty of Silent Auctions in the past and let's face it, if you don't have a large selection of cool items to bid on the auctions are more of a flop. Give some thought on what you might be able to add to the auction. This is another easy way for us to raise funds for the camp, and honestly, it's always fun to see what's there to bid on.

I hope all of you have an amazing month and don't forget about the Camp. You make the Camp possible every year. Making it possible cost money but remember smiles and laughter are priceless.

What: Casino Night for the Georgia Lions Camp


**Where:** American Legion Post, 4220 S Main St, Acworth, GA 30101

In consideration for receiving permission to participate in the GLCB Alumni Reunion I hereby RELEASE, WAIVE, DISCHARGE, COVENANT NOT TO SUE AND HOLD HARMLESS: The GLCB Alumni Association, its Commission, and any partner, employee, servant, representative, associate, officer, agent, volunteer, successor and assigns of The City of Fort Lauderdale, (hereinafter referred to as RELEASEES) from any and all liability, claims, demands, action, judgments, costs, expenses, court costs, attorney fees and causes of action whatsoever arising out of or related to any loss, damage, or injury, including death, that may be sustained by me, or to any property belonging to me, WHETHER CAUSED BY THE, including but not limited to, SOLE, CONTRIBUTORY OR GROSS NEGLIGENCE OF THE RELEASEES, or otherwise, while participating in such activity, or while in, on or upon the premises where the activity is being conducted.
- 2. I hereby elect to voluntarily participate in said activity, and to enter the above-named premises and engage in such activity knowing that certain risk of harm is or may be inherent in the various activities contemplated herein and that the activity may be hazardous to me and my property. I VOLUNTARILY ASSUME FULL RESPONSIBILITY FOR ANY RISKS OF LOSS, PROPERTY DAMAGE OR PERSONAL INJURY, INCLUDING DEATH, that may be sustained by me, or any loss or damage to property owned by me as a result of being engaged in such an activity, WHETHER CAUSED BY THE, including but not limited to, SOLE, CONTRIBUTORY OR GROSS NEGLIGENCE OF RELEASEES or otherwise.

# **Work Projects**

### April 29-May 1, 2022 are our next scheduled Service Days:

(Please know that you can call and schedule a workday anytime the camp does not have an event going on)

#### (You don't have to wait until a scheduled Service Day to come work at the camp)

- 1. Buildings need pressure washing.
- 2. Weed pulling, edging, raking, wheel barrow use, and sanitation are many other jobs to be done during this work session. BRING your gloves and definitely some BUG SPRAY!!
- 3. Repair the Whale Watch element at the Low Ropes Course.
- 4. Climbing Wall due for pressure washing and wood treatment (Man lift will need to be rented to accomplish this task). Other minor maintenance can be done during this activity.
- 5. Clean Low Ropes area.
- 6. Repair screens at the bar-b-que shelter.
- 7. Wooden picnic tables need repairs or replacing. (Some work has been done, need more help) some painting needed.
- 8. Nature Trail clean up debris. To build up low lying areas we continue to need Two loads of crushed asphalt and Two loads of fill dirt.
- 9. Clean up fallen debris from trees around the camp.
- 10. Several dead pine trees need to be cut down and debris cleaned up.
- 11. Paint water heater room located behind the newly renovated Staff Building.
- 12. Paint the Water Tank.
- 13. Paint the new Lifeguard stands for the pool.
- 14. Stain and treat all wooden rockers and chairs.
- 15. Paint the pump house at the pond.
- 16. Fish Pond needs some fall cleanup.
- 17. Paint sidewalks at the exit doors to the bunkhouse.
- 18. Repair Emergency exit door at restrooms in the Dining Hall.
- 19. Clean and paint swing frames at the fire pit area.
- 20. Swings at the fire pit need to be cleaned and painted.
- 21. Activity Site Warning signs have been replaced and repaired but framing needs cleaning and painting.
- 22. Repaint Dining Hall.
- 23. Some Emergency Lights in Main Dorm needs to be replaced.
- 24. Lights in Large Dormitory and Bunkhouse Dormitory still need to be converted to LED bulbs.
- \*Remove carpet from (Rental House) (Director's house)
- \*(Rental House) Replace carpet with laminate flooring. Funding needed. \*These two items will be completed when funds are available.
